C O N T E N T S

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Important points to be noted prominently by the candidates appearing for 'CET 2006'

1. The information / particulars furnished by candidates in their 'CET 2006' application form is FINAL. The application form containing false / incomplete information is liable to be rejected, at any point of time. Application should not contain any separate enclosures.
2. Before claiming eligibility for Government seats, make sure that you satisfy any one of the eligibility clauses detailed in Item – 7 of Chapter – I of the brochure. The candidates who do not satisfy any of the eligibility clauses will not be entitled for admission to Government seats through CET Cell. In other words, Non-Karnataka candidates are not eligible to appear for the entrance test conducted by the CET Cell.
3. From this year, the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants are required to appear for the Common Entrance Test / Aptitude Test for admission to professional courses for the seats earmarked for them by the Government. (Refer Item – 8(5) of Chapter – I of the brochure.)
4. If you are claiming eligibility under rural quota, ascertain that you have studied TEN full academic years between 1st and 10th standards in a place OTHER THAN the places mentioned in **APPENDIX – III**.
5. Candidates who are studying 2nd PUC / 12th standard within Karnataka, will get their Admission Tickets through the respective schools / colleges. The Karnataka candidates who are studying 12th standard outside the state of Karnataka will get the Admission Tickets by 'Speed Post' to the address furnished by them in the application form.
6. Candidates should read the instructions printed on the OMR answer sheets before answering. Candidates have to mark the correct answers on the OMR answer sheets using **BLUE OR BLACK INK BALL POINT PEN ONLY**.
7. Each candidate will be allowed to carry a replica of the filled OMR answer sheet, after the completion of each session of the test. Such replicas have to be preserved for a period of one year.
8. **KEY ANSWERS** will be published within TEN days after the completion of entrance test on the CET website. About four days of time will be given for the candidates / parents / teachers, to file objections, if any, in respect of any of the published key answers, along with all the supporting documents and justifications. It has to be sent to the Special Officer, CET Cell on or before 26-05-2006. Objections received by the CET Cell will be placed before an Expert Committee, whose decision will be final in this regard.
9. The seat selection in respect of Physically Disabled, NCC and Sports special category candidates will be held separately.
10. The candidates who are claiming eligibility under special categories such as NCC, Sports, Anglo-Indian, Defence and Ex-Defence should submit their special category documents to the CET Cell invariably on the dates notified at Page – 22 of this brochure. The candidates who do not submit the special category certificates well within the notified dates will not be considered to claim a seat under the respective special category.
11. Candidates belonging to SC, ST and **Other Backward Classes (OBC) such as Category - 1, 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B** should furnish their caste and income details invariably in the boxes provided in the application form and should bring the Caste / Caste-Income certificates issued by the concerned Tahasildar and a duly sworn affidavit as per the prescribed format given at **APPENDIX - V** on the day of seat selection.

12. The candidates claiming eligibility under Minority category should invariably mention the Minority Code in the box provided in the application form and should compulsorily produce the certificate indicating the Religion and Mother Tongue obtained from the head of the institution where the candidate has passed the 10th standard / SSLC examination, as per the admission register of the institution. (Refer **APPENDIX - V**)
13. FROM THIS YEAR, THERE WILL BE NO NEGATIVE EVALUATION IN RESPECT OF WRONG ANSWERS. MARKS WILL NOT BE AWARDED IN RESPECT OF THE MULTIPLE ANSWERS, MADE BY CANDIDATES IN BOTH COMMON ENTRANCE TEST AND APTITUDE TEST.
14. A candidate who had obtained a seat in the previous years in any discipline through the CET Cell, will not be eligible for selection of a seat in the same discipline during this year. Such a candidate who select a seat in the other discipline will forfeit the seat already selected during previous years.

WHAT IS NEW THIS YEAR ?

- The rank list for Medical & Dental courses will be published only in respect of candidates who secure 50% of marks taken together in PCB subjects in the qualifying examination and 50% of marks taken together in PCB subjects in the Common Entrance Test. (40% in case of SC, ST, CAT – 1, 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B category candidates.)
- The rank list for Medical & Dental courses will be prepared and published only on the basis of marks secured by candidates in PCB subjects in the Common Entrance Test.
- The candidates who secure less than 50% of marks taken together in PCB subjects in the Common Entrance Test, will not be awarded any rank for admission to Medical & Dental courses. (less than 40% in case of SC, ST, CAT – 1, 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B category candidates.)
- The rank list for Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy courses will be published only in respect of candidates who secure 50% of marks taken together in PCB subjects in the qualifying examination, irrespective of marks secured in PCB subjects in the Common Entrance Test. (40% in case of SC, ST, CAT – 1, 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B category candidates.)
- The rank list for Engineering & Technology courses will be published only in respect of candidates who secure 45% of marks taken together in the optional subjects in the qualifying examination, irrespective of marks secured in PCM subjects in the Common Entrance Test. (40% in case of SC, ST, CAT – 1, 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B category candidates.)
- The rank list for Architecture course will be published only in respect of candidates who secure 50% of marks taken together in all subjects in the qualifying examination and 40% of marks taken together in both Part – I & II of the Aptitude Test.
- The candidates who secure less than 40% of marks taken together in both Part – I & II of the Aptitude Test, will not be awarded any rank for admission to Architecture course.
- There will be no negative evaluation in respect of wrong answers. Marks will not be awarded in respect of multiple answers made by candidates, in both Common Entrance Test and Aptitude Test.
- The 'CET 2006' OMR Answer Sheets will have unique **BAR CODING** in respect of all subjects. The candidates are advised not to mutilate / damage or to make any stray marks on the **BAR CODES** and also on the **TIMING MARKS** on the OMR Answer Sheets. (Refer

CHAPTER – I

1. INTRODUCTION

The Karnataka Common Entrance Test and Aptitude Test 2006 is being conducted for the purpose of determining the eligibility / merit, for admission of Karnataka candidates and the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants to the First year or First semester of full time courses in Medical, Dental, Ayurveda, Unani, Homoeopathy, Naturopathy & Yoga, Engineering, Technology and Architecture courses, in Government / University / Aided courses in Private Aided colleges **and also for the seats filled by the State Government in Aided and Un-aided minority & non-minority institutions on the basis of consensus*** between the Government and the Institutions which are specified by the Government by notification in professional educational institutions in the state of Karnataka for the academic year 2006-07.

* In case no consensus is arrived at with Private Professional institutions, the 'CET 2006' application form will be applicable **ONLY** in respect of seats in Government, University and Aided courses in Private Aided institutions in the State of Karnataka.

*Admissions to the Government seats shall be made in accordance with the **Karnataka Selection of Candidates for Admission to Government Seats in Professional Educational Institutions Rules, 2006** (in short '**Rules**') as amended from time to time and therefore the details and instructions contained in this Brochure are subject to the said Rules. **In case of any discrepancy, the Rules shall prevail.***

2. MODE OF CONDUCTING THE TEST

In order to obtain admission to any of the professional courses through CET Cell, a candidate will have to appear in the Common Entrance Test / Aptitude Test, which will be conducted by the Common Entrance Test Cell, Bangalore (Herein after referred to as the CET Cell). The Common Entrance Test will be conducted at **41** places, spread over Karnataka (See **APPENDIX - I** for details). Candidates who have studied the Qualifying Examination within Karnataka should write 'CET 2006' in a test centre assigned by the CET Cell within the district in which the candidate studied 2nd PUC or 12th standard. The schedule of the written test is as follows :

* The candidates claiming Government seats under Horanadu & Gadinadu Kannadiga clauses and whose mother tongue is Kannada, Tulu or Kodava, will have to undergo a Kannada language test, to establish their ability to speak, read and write Kannada. The Kannada Language test will be conducted by the CET Cell on **11-05-2006 at 11.00 a.m.** in the premises of CET Cell Office, Bangalore. Such candidates will have to appear for the 'Common Entrance Test 2006' only in a test centre located at **BANGALORE**. The relevant photocopy of the original documents of the parents in support of their claim such as marks cards, study certificates, etc., should be produced on the day of Kannada Language Test.

** For admission to Architecture course, appearance in the **APTITUDE TEST** conducted by the CET Cell is compulsory. Interested candidates should give their option in the application form for writing the Aptitude Test. The Aptitude Test will be held on **12-05-2006** in **BANGALORE, BELGAUM, GULBARGA** and **MYSORE** as per the notified time schedule and the centre for writing the Aptitude Test will be mentioned in their 'CET 2006' admission tickets. Separate ranks will be assigned for Architecture course, based on their performance in the Aptitude Test and the Qualifying Examination. **This year, all the candidates, including the SC, ST & OBC category candidates, who appear for the Aptitude Test should invariably secure not less than 40% of marks taken together in both Part – I & Part – II of the Aptitude Test.** Marks obtained by the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects in the Common Entrance Test will not be taken into account for determining the merit / rank, for admission to Architecture course.

Based on the performance of the candidates in the Common Entrance Test / Aptitude Test and the Qualifying Examination, as the case may be, the merit / rank list will be prepared and published. All the candidates will be allowed to participate during the seat selection process in the order of their merit / rank for selecting the available seats, as per the time schedule given in **APPENDIX - VII**.

3. WHO CAN APPLY ?

A candidate who has passed the second year Pre-University or 12th standard or equivalent examination (herein after referred to as the “qualifying examination” or “Q. E.” in short) with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English as one of the languages of study and obtained an aggregate minimum of 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Q. E. and who has secured not less than 50% of marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Common Entrance Test (herein after referred to as “CET”) is eligible for admission to **Medical and Dental** courses. (40% of marks in both Q. E. and CET in case of SC, ST & OBC Category candidates.)

Based on the performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Common Entrance Test, the Medical rank list will be prepared and published for admission to Medical and Dental courses.

A candidate who has passed the Q. E. with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English as one of the languages of study and obtained an aggregate minimum of 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in the Q. E. is eligible for admission to **Ayurveda / Homoeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga** courses. (40% of marks in Q. E. in case of SC, ST & OBC Category candidates.)

Based on the performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in both Common Entrance Test and the Qualifying Examination by taking the marks in equal proportions, the ISMH rank list will be prepared and published separately for admission to Ayurveda / Homoeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga courses.

Further, the candidates seeking admission to Medical / Dental / Ayurveda / Homoeopathy / Unani / Naturopathy & Yoga courses, should have completed the age of seventeen years as on **31st December of 2006**.

A candidate who has passed the Q. E. with Physics and Mathematics as compulsory subjects along with Chemistry / Bio-Technology / Computer Science / Biology / Electronics as optional subjects with English as one of the languages of study and obtained an aggregate minimum of 45% marks in the optional subjects in the Q. E. is eligible for **Engineering and Technology** courses. (40% of marks in Q. E. in case of SC, ST & OBC Category candidates.) Provided that, the marks obtained by candidate in Bio-Technology / Computer Science / Biology / Electronics in the Q. E., will be considered in place of Chemistry for the purpose of determination of eligibility in respect of Engineering and Technology courses.

Based on the performance of the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects in both Common Entrance Test and the Qualifying Examination by taking the marks in equal proportions, the Engineering rank list will be prepared and published.

A candidate who has passed the Q. E. with Mathematics as one of the optional subjects and English as one of the languages of study along with other subjects and **obtained at least 50% marks** in aggregate in all subjects, is eligible for **Architecture** course. Provided that all the candidates, including the SC, ST & OBC Category candidates, who are interested in admission to Architecture course, should appear for both PART –1 & PART – 2 of the Aptitude Test compulsorily and obtain an aggregate minimum of 40% marks in both PART –1 & PART – 2. Marks obtained by the candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects in the Common Entrance Test will not be taken into account for determining the merit / rank, for admission to Architecture course.

Based on the performance of candidates in both Aptitude Test and Qualifying Examination by taking the marks in equal proportions, Architecture rank list will be prepared and published.

The SC / ST / OBC eligibility criteria is applicable to persons of Karnataka origin who are claiming eligibility for Government seats under clauses (a), (b), (f), (h), (j), (k) and (l) and the same is not applicable to clauses (c), (d), (e), (g), (i) and (m) of Item - 7 of Chapter – I.

Not only a candidate who has passed the qualifying examination with requisite marks but also a candidate who has appeared for the Q. E. and expecting the results is eligible to apply for the Common Entrance Test / Aptitude Test.

The repeaters and ex-students of Karnataka 2nd PUC, CBSE, CISCE and other candidates claiming eligibility for Government seats, should invariably send a photocopy of their Q. E. marks card (on which the CET admission ticket number is boldly written) to the CET Cell soon after the completion of Common Entrance Test on or before 15-05-2006, failing which, the results of such candidates will be with-held for want of Q. E. Marks. However, intermediary ranks / Spot ranks will be assigned for the candidates whose results have been with-held, subsequent to the submission of photocopy of the Q. E. marks card. See box at Page - 21 about intermediary ranks / Spot ranks / ranks ending with G55, etc.,

The candidates who are appearing for Karnataka 2nd PUC Annual 2006 as freshers need not furnish the Q. E. marks, as it will be obtained directly from the Department of PUE.

After the publication of Karnataka 2nd PUC annual 2006 results, the candidates who apply for revaluation or retotalling should invariably produce the revised marks card to the CET Cell immediately for getting the new ranks assigned.

4. HOW & WHERE TO GET THE BROCHURE WITH APPLICATION FORM ?

Candidates who have studied or studying their 2nd PUC or 12th standard in educational institutions within Karnataka should get their brochure with application forms by submitting a demand draft for **Rs. 550/-** to the Principals of the institutions in which they had studied or studying or appeared for the 2nd PUC or 12th standard examination. (**Rs. 400/-** in case of SC / ST / Category-1 candidates.) The Principals of all the Schools and Colleges in Karnataka teaching 2nd PUC or 12th standard including CBSE & CISCE syllabi have been requested to collect the filled application forms and forward the same to the CET Cell both from freshers & repeater students. The last day for submission of D. D.s to concerned Principals will be **16-03-2006**.

The Karnataka candidates who have studied or who are studying 12th standard or intermediate or pre-degree or equivalent examination outside Karnataka (including Horanadu, Gadinadu & other Karnataka candidates), can get the brochure with application only through 'Speed Post', directly from the CET Cell, by sending a cloth lined self-addressed envelope of 25 cms x 30 cms size and a demand draft for **Rs. 650/-** drawn in favour of the "**Special Officer, CET Cell, Bangalore**" payable at Bangalore and Karnataka candidates residing outside India can get the brochures by sending a demand draft for **Rs. 2000/-**. The envelope in which the said two items are sent should be boldly super scribed with the words "**REQUEST FOR CET 2006 BROCHURE**" and should be sent individually by "SPEED POST" only. The last day for receipt of request for brochure with application forms will be **18-03-2006**.

NOTE : The Non-Karnataka candidates are not eligible to appear for the entrance test and also for the later seat selection conducted by the CET Cell, during this year.

5. HOW TO FILL THE APPLICATION FORM ?

The application form, which is common to all the courses with regard to admission to professional institutions through CET cell, is enclosed with this brochure. The candidates should fill the application form using a **BALL POINT PEN** in capital letters only.

PLEASE NOTE : The filled application form submitted by the candidates will be scanned as it is. The details of the application form will be the candidate's data for all further processing in the CET Cell computers. Therefore, the candidates are advised not to make any stray marks on the application form and not to enclose any documents / papers in support of their claims to the filled application form.

IMPORTANT : The information / particulars furnished by the candidates in their 'CET 2006' application form is FINAL. The information with regard to Mother Tongue, Religion, Reserved Category, Caste, Annual Income, Minority status, Special category, etc., if any, should be filled invariably in the respective boxes in the application form. In case, if any of the information furnished in the application form is found to be false / incorrect, the application is liable to be rejected at any point of time and the seat selected by the candidate is also liable to be cancelled at any stage and the entire fee amount paid by such candidate will be forfeited.

14. **Name of the place where you wish to write the Aptitude Test ?** : For admission to Architecture course, the candidates should compulsorily appear for both PART – I & PART – II of the Aptitude Test conducted by the CET Cell on **12-05-2006** at **BANGALORE, BELGAUM, GULBARGA** and **MYSORE**. Indicate the name of the place where you wish to write the Aptitude Test, from among these four places.

15. **Eligibility clause code** : Eligibility for Government seats should be indicated by mentioning the CODE of the appropriate eligibility **CLAUSE as per Item - 7 of Chapter - I of the brochure** from (a) to (m).
16. **Are you appearing for Karnataka 2nd PUC Annual 2006 ?** : Please tick (✓) the appropriate box. If you are appearing for Karnataka 2nd PUC Annual 2006, mention the **Register number of 2nd PUC (2006)** in the space provided. You are also required to mention the **PUC student number** assigned individually to all PU students along with your **PUC College Code** assigned to all PU colleges by the PUE Department of Karnataka in the spaces provided and get it verified by the Principal of your College.

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NOTE : The candidates whose Qualifying Examination is other than Karnataka 2nd PUC (i.e., CBSE, CISCE, etc.) need not furnish the register number, student number and PUC College Code in the application form. However, they are required to send a photocopy of their Q. E. marks card (on which the CET admission ticket number is boldly written) to CET Cell soon after the completion of Common Entrance Test on or before 15-05-2006.

17. Mention the total number of years of study in the state of Karnataka between 1st and 12th Standards in the space provided.
- If you have studied 10 full academic years from 1st and 10th Standards in places other than the places mentioned in **APPENDIX – III** and if you are not coming under the creamy layer, tick (✓) the box against 'Yes'. If not, tick (✓) against 'No'.
- If you have studied 10 full academic years between 1st and 10th Standards in Kannada medium, tick (✓) the box against 'Yes'. If not, tick (✓) against 'No'.
18. **Are you claiming reservation under SC / ST ?** : If you wish to claim reservation benefits under SC / ST reserved categories, tick (✓) the box against 'Yes' and mention **Name of the Caste**. If not, tick (✓) against 'No'.
19. **Are you claiming reservation under OBC ?** : If you wish to claim reservation benefits under the Other Backward Classes (OBC) such as Category – 1, 2A, 2B, 3A & 3B reserved categories, tick (✓) the box against 'Yes' and mention **Name of the Caste**. If not, tick (✓) against 'No'.
20. If you are claiming the **Reservation benefits**, (including SC, ST & OBC) indicate the respective reserved category code in the box provided, as per the following codes. Also, mention the **Annual Income of parents from all sources** in the box provided.

NOTE : Candidates claiming reservation benefits should produce the Caste certificate corresponding to the same Caste / Category claimed in their application form, during the admission round seat selection process.

25. **Telephone details** : The residence telephone number and the mobile phone number, if available, should be furnished invariably, along with the STD codes in the box provided. If not available, then mention any available contact number.

26. **Full Postal Address** : Candidates should carefully write their complete postal address in block letters to which all correspondence can be speedily reached. City name, State and Pin Code should be filled invariably.
27. **Candidate's Photograph** : The candidate is required to firmly paste a **recent** passport size photograph within the space provided on the application form using gum. The photograph should not cover the signature area below it. Do not use stapler or pin, as the scanner will reject the stapled photographs. Do not paste old photograph on the application form.

IMPORTANT : If the photograph affixed on the application form does not match with the actual candidate present during examination, he will not be allowed to write the test. Also, if the photograph does not tally with the actual candidate present during seat selection, he will not be permitted to select the seat.

28. **Study Details** : The candidates must furnish the academic study details between 1st to 12th Standards, mentioning the full name and address of the institutions studied and respective telephone numbers, if available, with STD codes, the academic years of study and the year of passing.
29. **Appearance in the previous Common Entrance Tests** : If you have appeared for the Common Entrance Tests conducted by the CET Cell in the previous years, then mention the year of appearance, the respective CET numbers and the details of seat selected, in the spaces provided on the application form.

NOTE : The candidates who have obtained a seat in the previous years in any discipline through the CET Cell will not be eligible for selection of a seat in the same discipline during this year. Such candidate who select seat in the other discipline will forfeit the seat already selected during the previous years.

IMPORTANT : After filling the application form, the candidate and parents should sign in the places provided along with date. **The candidate should invariably sign on both the places on the application form.** The candidates are advised to maintain the same signature on the OMR answer sheets, nominal roll, etc., during the conduct of test and also on various registers / forms, admission order etc., during the seat selection process.

The candidates are advised to preserve a photocopy of their filled application form, before submitting the same to the respective Principals / CET Cell.

6. WHERE TO SUBMIT THE FILLED APPLICATION FORM ?

The candidates who have received the brochure with application forms through their schools or colleges should submit their filled applications in the respective schools or colleges. The Principals of all the schools and colleges in Karnataka teaching PUC or 12th standard including CBSE & CISCE syllabi, have been requested to collect the filled application forms and forward the same to the CET Cell both from freshers & repeater students. The last date for submission of filled application forms to the concerned Principals will be **28-03-2006**. Candidates who have submitted their filled applications through the schools and colleges should collect their admission tickets from the respective schools and colleges on or after **26-04-2006** and the candidates who fail to get their admission ticket, should immediately contact their respective Principals with the photocopy of their filled application form.

The Karnataka candidates residing outside Karnataka (Including Horanadu, Gadinadu and other Karnataka candidates) who have procured their brochure with applications through "Speed Post" should send the filled application forms only by **Speed Post** directly to CET Cell on or before **31-03-2006** and such candidates will get their admission tickets to their home addresses as furnished by them in their application forms, by "Speed Post" on or after **26-04-2006**. The Karnataka candidates residing outside Karnataka, who fail to get the admission ticket well within the specified time, should immediately contact the Special Officer, CET Cell, along with a photocopy of the Demand Draft, the filled application form and the "Speed Post" acknowledgement for having sent the application form to CET Cell. Otherwise, the admission tickets will not be issued in respect of such candidates.

NOTE : In order to avoid any complications, the Karnataka candidates residing out side Karnataka are advised to send their filled application forms individually, only through "Speed Post" and not in person or by any other mode such as Ordinary Post / Registered Post / Private Courier.

ASSIGNMENT OF EXAM CENTRES

Candidates who have studied the Q. E. within Karnataka should write CET in a test centre within the district in which the candidate studied 2nd PUC or 12th standard. If the CET test centres are located in more than one place in a district, the candidate can choose one of the places. If there is more than one test centre in a place, then the decision to assign the test centre will rest with the CET Cell and the CET Cell will decide on random basis the test centre of a candidate.

The Horanadu & Gadinadu Kannadiga candidates claiming eligibility under **clauses 'c' and 'd'**, will have to undergo a Kannada language test, which will be held on **11-05-2006** at **11.00 a. m.** in the premises of CET Cell Office, Bangalore. Such candidates will have to appear for the 'Common Entrance Test 2006' in a test centre located only at **BANGALORE**.

The candidates who are interested only in Architecture course, should compulsorily appear for both part - 1 and part - 2 of the Aptitude Test conducted by CET Cell in a test centre in **BANGALORE, BELGAUM, GULBARGA** and **MYSORE** centres on **12-05-2006**. The venue for the aptitude test will be notified to candidates in their 'CET 2006' admission tickets.

All the candidates are required to mention the name of the exam place in item - 13 in the application form invariably, failing which they will be assigned a test centre in BANGALORE. (See APPENDIX - I for details.)

7. ELIGIBILITY FOR GOVERNMENT SEATS

Candidates who satisfy one of the following Clauses / Eligibility Criteria / Conditions laid down under Admission Rules, will ONLY QUALIFY for admission to Government seats. Each condition is specified as a clause and is individually referred by a code. The candidates who do not satisfy any of the Clauses / Eligibility Criteria / Conditions detailed below, will not be eligible for admission to professional courses under Government seats. Therefore, such candidates need not apply. The Eligibility clauses and respective codes are as follows:

ELIGIBILITY CLAUSES

CODES

The candidate should have studied and passed in one or more Government or Government recognised educational institutions located in the State of Karnataka for a minimum period of SEVEN academic years commencing from I standard to 2nd PUC / 12th standard as on 1st July of the year in which the Entrance Test is held and must have appeared and passed either SSLC / 10th standard or 2nd PUC / 12th standard examination from Karnataka State.

a

In case of the candidate who had taken more than one year to pass a class or standard, the years of academic study is counted as one year only.

The candidate should have studied and passed both I and II year Pre-University Examination or 11th & 12th standard examination within the State of Karnataka from an Educational Institution run or recognized by the State Government and that either of the parents should have studied in Karnataka for a minimum period of SEVEN years, which should be evident from the certificates issued by the concerned institutions.

b

In the case of candidates whose mother tongue is Kannada, Tulu or Kodava and who are residing outside the State of Karnataka as on 1st July of 2006, such candidates should have passed the qualifying examination from an University or Board or any other Institution located outside Karnataka ; provided also that the candidate shall undergo a Kannada language test, which will be conducted by the CET Cell on 11-05-2006 at 11.00 a.m. to establish his ability to speak, read and write Kannada.

c

A candidate whose mother tongue is Kannada, Tulu or Kodava and who resides in disputed Kannada speaking area of South Sholapur or Akkalkot or Jath or Gadhinglaj Taluks of Maharashtra State or Kasargod Taluk of Kerala State. The candidate shall undergo a Kannada language test, which will be conducted by the CET Cell on 11-05-2006 at 11.00 a.m. to establish his ability to speak, read and write Kannada.

d

In the case of a candidate who is son or daughter of Defence personnel who has worked continuously in Karnataka for a minimum period of one year between 1st July of 2005 to 30th June of 2006. The candidate should have studied and passed the qualifying examination from any Government or Government recognised educational institution located in Karnataka.

e

Son or daughter of serving Defence personnel who at the time of joining the Defence service had declared his / her hometown a place in the State of Karnataka. Proof of such domicile should be obtained and produced by obtaining the extract from the Record Office of the Defence unit.

f

In the case of a candidate who is a son or daughter of a Defence personnel who had served in Karnataka for at least one year and is posted on duty in Field / Active Service and whose family is permitted by Defence Authorities to continue to stay in Karnataka. Such candidate should have studied and passed the qualifying examination from any Government or Government recognised educational institution located in Karnataka.

g

Son or daughter of an ex-servicemen who at the time of joining the Defence service had declared a place in Karnataka as his home town, proof of such domicile should be obtained and produced from the "Deputy Director, Department of Sainik Welfare and Resettlement".

h

In the case of a candidate being a son or daughter of an employee of the Union Government or an employee of the Union or Karnataka State Government Undertaking or Joint Sector Undertaking, who is liable to be transferred anywhere in India as per the terms and conditions of his employment and has worked in Karnataka for a minimum period of one year from 1st July of 2005 to 30th June of 2006 and such candidate has studied and passed the qualifying examination from any Government or Government recognised educational institution located in Karnataka.

i

Son or daughter of a working or retired employee of the Union Government or employee of Union or Karnataka State Government undertaking or Joint Sector undertaking where such employee;

- (a) had declared to the employer at the time of joining service any place in Karnataka to be his home town; and
- (b) had studied in any Government or Government recognised educational institution or institutions located in Karnataka for a minimum period of seven years; and
- (c) was or is liable to be transferred anywhere in India as per the terms and conditions of his employment.

j

Son or daughter of Members of Parliament elected from Karnataka.

k

Son or daughter of serving or retired employee :

- (a) belonging to All India Service of Karnataka cadre; and
- (b) of the Karnataka State Government,

who has served or is serving outside the State of Karnataka during the period corresponding to Candidate's study outside the State from 1st standard to 2nd PUC or 12th standard examination can be added to make up the seven years study within Karnataka as required under clause (a) above.

l

Son or daughter of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants, proof of such migration (IDENTITY CARD) should be obtained and produced from the jurisdictional "District Magistrate and Deputy Commissioner" of any state in India.

m

NOTE : In case, if any of the documents produced in respect of the Clause claimed by the candidate is found to be false / incorrect, the seat selected by the candidate will be cancelled at any stage and the entire fee amount paid by such candidate will be forfeited.

8. RESERVATION OF SEATS IN FAVOUR OF CERTAIN CATEGORIES

(1) RESERVATION FOR SPECIAL CATEGORY CANDIDATES

(a) Candidates,

- (i) who have participated in **Republic Day Camp** conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards; or
- (ii) who have participated in the following camps conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards namely;
 - (a) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Boys) - TSC (B) ; (b) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Girls) - TSC (G) ; (c) All India Nau Sainik Camp - NSC ; (d) All India Vayu Sainik Camp - VSC AND Youth Exchange Programmes and Foreign Naval Cruise** organised by DG, NCC.
- (iii) who have participated in the following camps conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards namely;
 - (a) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Boys) - TSC (B) ; (b) All India Thal Sainik Camp (Girls) - TSC (G) ; (c) All India Nau Sainik Camp - NSC ; (d) All India Vayu Sainik Camp - VSC AND in the complete - Mountaineering Expeditions (over 5900 Mtrs), Sailing Expeditions using wind power only (401 KMs), Motor Cycle Expeditions (more than 3500 KMs) and Cycling Expeditions (more than 1500 KMs),** organised by DG, NCC / NCC Directorate of Karnataka & Goa.
- (iv) who have participated in the following camps / courses conducted by the Directorate General of NCC, New Delhi from Karnataka and who possess at least 'B' Certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards namely : **(a) NIC ; (b) Trekking ; (c) Mountaineering ; (d) BLC ; (e) ALC ; (f) RCTC and (g) Army, Navy, Air Force & Hospital Attachments.**
- (v) who possess at least 'B' certificate obtained during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards.

P

Provided that for selection of a reserved seat under NCC category, the preferential criteria are as follows :

- Preference 1** : Candidates possessing 'B' Certificate and adjudged overall All India Best Cadet with Gold / Silver / Bronze medal in the Republic Day camp.
- Preference 2** : 'B' certificate holders who have won Gold / Silver / Bronze medal in the camps mentioned at (a) to (d) of sub-clause (ii) above.
- Preference 3** : 'B' certificate holders who have participated in the **Youth Exchange Programmes and Foreign Naval Cruise** organised by DG, NCC.
- Preference 4** : 'B' certificate holders who have participated from Karnataka in the Republic Day camp.
- Preference 5** : 'B' Certificate holders who have participated from Karnataka in the camps mentioned at (a) to (d) of sub-clause (iii) above.
- Preference 6** : 'B' Certificate holders who have participated in the **Mountaineering / Sailing / Motor Cycle / Cycling Expeditions** organised by DG, NCC / NCC Directorate of Karnataka & Goa.
- Preference 7** : 'B' Certificate holders who have participated in the camps mentioned in sub-clause (iv) above.
- Preference 8** : Candidates possessing ONLY 'B' Certificate.

Provided that, while considering the candidates mentioned in sub-clauses (i) and (ii) above, gold medal winners will be preferred to silver medallist who in turn will be preferred to bronze medallist under the respective sub-clauses.

Provided further that the candidates belonging to sub-clause (v) i.e., only 'B' certificate holders (PREFERENCE - 8) shall be eligible to select the NCC special category seats, if any, in the general round of seat selection along with the other General Merit and reserved category candidates as per their merit order.

Provided also that the Director of NCC or his authorised nominee shall be present in the CET Cell on the appointed days **(27-06-2006 and 28-06-2006)** along with the list of eligible NCC candidates to assist in the selection of candidates under NCC special category.

(b) Candidates,

- (i) who have represented the country and won medals / cups in the SUPER-A Games specified in **APPENDIX - IV** during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards;
- (ii) who have represented the country and won medals / cups in 'A – Games' specified in **APPENDIX - IV** during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards;
- (iii) who have won medals / cups in 'B-Games' specified in **APPENDIX - IV** by representing Karnataka State and participated in the SUPER-A Games or A-Games specified in **APPENDIX - IV** during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards;
- (iv) who have represented Karnataka State in 'B-Games' specified in **APPENDIX - IV** and won medals / cups during the five year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards;
- (v) who have represented Karnataka State in any sports or games in the 'B-Games' specified in **APPENDIX - IV** during the five-year period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards.

Q

Provided that for selection of a reserved seat in Sports category, the candidates who belong to sub-clause (i) shall be considered **first**; candidates who belong to sub-clause (ii) shall be considered **second**; candidates who belong to sub-clause (iii) shall be considered **third** and candidates who belong to sub-clause (iv) shall be considered **fourth** before considering the candidates belonging to sub-clause (v).

Provided further that, while considering the candidates mentioned in sub-clauses (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv), gold medal winners will be preferred to silver medallist who in turn will be preferred to bronze medallist under the respective sub-clauses, irrespective of the number of medals.

Provided also that the candidates belonging to sub-clause (v) i.e., only who have represented the Karnataka State, shall be eligible to select the Sports special category seats, if any, in the general round of seat selection along with the other General Merit and reserved category candidates as per their merit order.

Provided also that the Commissioner for Youth Services and Sports or his authorised nominee shall be present in the CET Cell on the appointed days (**29-06-2006 and 30-06-2006**) along with the list of eligible candidates to assist in the selection of candidates under Sports category.

- (c) Candidates who as Scouts / Guides have received the "President's Award" during five years period of study in Karnataka between 8th and 12th standards. Provided that the candidates shall submit the "President's Award" (Rashtrapati) certificate on the day of general round of seat selection as per their merit order.

R

- (d) Son or daughter of Defence Personnel falling under Clauses (e), (f) and (g) of Item – 7 of Chapter - I of the Brochure.

T

Defence personnel for the purpose of these clauses means a person in Defence Service including Personnel belonging to Civil GT COYS ASC who were Civilian Class 'III' or Class 'IV' Government servants and 'Border Roads Organisational Personnel'. (Vide Notification No. ED 189 TGL 94 Bangalore dated 29-07-1994).

- (e) Son or daughter of Ex-Servicemen falling under Item - 7(h) of Chapter - I of the Brochure.

U

Ex-Servicemen for the purpose of this clause includes personnel belonging to Civil GT COYS ASC who were Civilian Class III or Class IV Government Servants, who became permanently disabled or were killed during hostilities.

- (f) Candidates who are physically disabled.

V

The candidate claiming a seat under the persons with disability category should appear on the appointed day (**26-06-2006**) before the Medical Board constituted by the Director of Medical Education, consisting of the Special Officer, three specialists, one each from the Department of Orthopaedics, Ophthalmology and ENT. The Medical Board shall examine the candidate and certify regarding the percentage of disability and the decision of the Medical Board shall be final. For the purpose of this proviso, persons with disability shall have the same meaning assigned to it, in the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Participation) Act 1995 (Central Act 1 / 1995).

Provided that the candidate suffering from less than forty percent of disability shall not be eligible for selection of a seat under the persons with disability category.

- (g) Candidates from Anglo Indian Community.

W

IMPORTANT : The Special category candidates who satisfy Clause (a) of Item – 7 of Chapter - I of the brochure, will also be eligible for claiming a seat under the respective Special categories.

- NOTE :**
1. Candidates belonging Scouts & Guides, Defence, Ex-defence and Anglo-Indian i. e., sub-clauses (c), (d), (e) and (g) above, will be allowed to select the respective special category seats as per their merit order in the general round of seat selection along with other general merit and reserved category candidates.
 2. Candidates who are having only 'B' certificate under NCC will be eligible to select the NCC special category seats, if any, in the general round of seat selection along with the other General Merit and reserved category candidates as per their merit order.
 3. Candidates who have only represented the Karnataka State in 'B – GAMES' under Sports, will be eligible to select the Sports special category seats, if any, in the general round of seat selection along with the other General Merit and reserved category candidates as per their merit order.
 4. Achievements made by the NCC / Sports special category candidates in the events / games, till the date of commencement of Common Entrance Test will be considered for selection of seats in the respective categories.

(2) RESERVATION FOR RESERVED CATEGORY CANDIDATES

Reservation is made in favour of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes of citizens under categories 1, 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B in accordance with Govt. Order No. SWL 251 BCA 94 dated 31st January 1995, as amended from time to time.

Production of a “**Caste Certificate / Caste Income Certificate**” issued by the concerned Jurisdictional Tahasildar in accordance with the Government order No. Sa Ka E 225 BCA 2002 dated 30th March 2002, as amended from time to time, in form 'D' in case of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes ; in form 'E' in case of Category-I ; in form 'F' for Other Backward Classes like 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B along with a duly sworn affidavit as per the prescribed format given at Page - 36, in support of the claim is mandatory for selecting a seat under reserved category.

Provided that candidates belonging to SC, ST & Category - I should produce an Income certificate issued by the Jurisdictional Tahasildar in the prescribed format given at Page - 36. (This is for the purpose of processing eligibility of candidates to claim Government of India scholarship).

Provided further that only candidates of Karnataka origin and who are claiming eligibility for Government seats in accordance with clause (a), (b), (f), (h), (j), (k) and (l) of Item - 7 of Chapter - I shall be eligible to claim the benefit of reservation under this sub-rule. The candidates claiming eligibility for Government seats under clauses (c), (d), (e), (g), (i) and (m) are not eligible to claim the benefit of reservation.

(3) RESERVATION FOR RURAL CANDIDATES

15% of the Government seats will be reserved horizontally in favour of rural candidates who have studied for 10 full academic years from 1st Standard to 10th Standard in educational institutions situated in places in the state of Karnataka other than larger urban area, smaller urban area or transitional area as mentioned in Karnataka Municipalities Act, 1964 or Karnataka Municipal Corporations Act, 1976 in accordance with the Government Order No. ED 01 TEC 2002, Bangalore, dated 01-02-2002 and the eligibility criteria shall be as defined in the Karnataka Reservation of Appointments of Posts in the Civil services of the State for Rural Candidates Act, 2000 (Karnataka Act 1 of 2001).

The candidates whose parents do not come under the creamy layer and the candidates who have studied TEN full academic years from 1st Standard to 10th Standard in places other than the places mentioned in **APPENDIX – III** will be eligible for claiming the benefit of Rural reservations.

(4) RESERVATION FOR KANNADA MEDIUM CANDIDATES

5% of the Government seats will be reserved in favour of the kannada medium candidates who have studied TEN full academic years in Kannada medium from 1st Standard to 10th Standard, in accordance with the Government Order No. ED 118 UEC 2000, Bangalore dated 04-06-2000 and as amended vide Government Order No. ED 02 UEC 2002, Bangalore dated 14-10-2005.

(5) RESERVATION FOR WARDS OF JAMMU & KASHMIRI MIGRANTS

Reservation is made in favour of the son / daughter of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants, who satisfy the eligibility condition for Government seats in accordance with clause (m) of Item – 7 of Chapter – I of the brochure i.e., One seat each in all the Government Medical and Dental Colleges AND One seat each in Engineering colleges, irrespective of course.

The interse merit determined under Rule - 7 (Please see Item - 5 of Chapter - II) will remain the same for the purpose of eligibility and benefit of reservation under Item - 8 of Chapter - I. If any seat reserved in favour of candidates belonging to any of the categories referred to above from (1) to (4) is not filled up due to non-availability of eligible candidates belonging to such categories, the reservation to that extent will stand reduced and will be transferred to the General Merit category.

CHAPTER – II

MORE ABOUT THE WRITTEN TEST

1. SYLLABUS

The question papers of the Common Entrance Test will be based on the First and Second year PUC revised syllabus prescribed by the Department of Pre-University Education of Karnataka State.

2. DURATION, QUESTION PAPER AND OMR ANSWER SHEETS

Each question paper will be of **70 minutes duration** and will be of **objective type**. The question paper in each subject will be in **16 different versions** and each version will contain **60 questions** and each question will have **four different options**. Each question will carry **ONE mark**. The candidate is expected to attempt all the 60 questions. In other words, **there is no choice among questions. THIS YEAR, THERE WILL BE NO NEGATIVE EVALUATION WITH REGARD TO WRONG ANSWERS AND MARKS WILL NOT BE AWARDED IN RESPECT OF MULTIPLE ANSWERS IN BOTH COMMON ENTRANCE TEST AND APTITUDE TEST.**

The version code of the question paper would have been boldly printed on facing sheet of the question paper. The version codes used in each subject will be from **A - 1 to A - 4, B - 1 to B - 4, C - 1 to C - 4 and D - 1 to D - 4**. The version code of the question papers given to a student may be different OR may be the same for different subjects.

The candidate will have to mark correct options on the **Optical Mark Reader (OMR) sheet**, which will be supplied at the beginning of each session of the test. **Among the answers provided against a question, only one answer will be correct. The candidate should mark the correct answer by filling / shading only one circle against a question, using blue or black ink ball point pen.** (Refer box item at Page - 18 for correct method / wrong methods of shading.) A specimen of the OMR answer sheet printed on an ordinary paper is given in Page - 19. More details about the purpose and use of OMR answer sheet is given at Page - 20.

The answer sheet comprises of two sheets. The top sheet, which is meant to be scanned for the purpose of valuation and the bottom sheet is meant to be carried home by the candidate after the examination. **The bottom sheet is coated with a special kind of chemical. When the candidate fills the circles on the top sheet, the pressure on the bottom sheet will create a replica of the top sheet.** After the examination, the invigilator will detach the bottom sheet from the top sheet at the perforations on the left side and hand over the bottom replica to the candidate and the candidate is allowed to carry the same with him. The top sheet will be retained by the invigilator for returning the same to the Deputy Chief Superintendent of the exam centre.

Optical Mark Reader sheets as Answer Sheets

A model of the Optical Mark Reader sheet that will be used for marking the answers by the candidates is given at Page - 19. The need for the replica has compelled us to design OMR sheet in such a way that all the information and the answers are marked only on one side. The top portion of the answer sheet is meant for furnishing the particulars about the candidates such as the Name, CET Number and serial number of the question booklet given to them in the exam hall. The square blocks in each item is meant for filling by the candidate in capital letters and numbers. The bottom portion is meant for writing and shading the question booklet version code and marking the answers. The subject would have been pre-marked in both top and bottom portions of the answer sheet. All entries on the OMR answer sheet should be made using blue or black ink ball point pen only. The 'CET 2006' OMR Answer Sheets will have unique **BAR CODING** on both top and bottom portions in respect of all the four subjects. The candidates are strictly advised not to mutilate / damage or to make any stray marks on **BAR CODES** and also on the **TIMING MARKS** printed on the OMR Answer Sheets.

Why Ball Point Pen ?

Remember, we are allowing the candidates to carry home a replica or facsimile of the OMR answer sheet and the OMR answer sheet comes in a set of two sheets. When you shade the top sheet, the pressure will create a dark mark on the bottom sheet on the corresponding circle. If a pen with a nib is used, the pressure on the top sheet will not be sufficient to activate the chemical on the bottom sheet. On the other hand, a ball point pen exerts sufficient pressure to convert the bottom sheet chemical into a dark spot. That is why we want you to use a black / blue ink ball point pen only.

Precautions to be taken while filling the top portion of OMR answer sheet

Please study the specimen OMR answer sheet given at Page - 19 carefully and get familiarised. You are also advised to have the photocopies of the specimen and practice on them. The initial FIVE minutes will be given to a candidate, for filling the particulars on the top portion of the OMR answer sheet. The top portion will have THREE items to be filled, viz., Name of the candidate, CET Number and Question booklet serial number. It is very important to enter these items correctly in the spaces provided on top portion of the OMR answer sheet.

Precautions in filling the version code and answers on bottom portion of OMR Answer sheet

Entering the 'question booklet version code' properly by filling and shading the right circle is very important. The computer would have been programmed to search for the correct answers depending upon the version code. So, if the candidate were to make use of a question booklet of one version code and enter wrongly some other version code number or leave the space unfilled, then the computer will search for correct answers in the wrong version or will abandon the search. Even if the candidate had marked the correct answers, the computer will not account for it, as it would be searching for the correct answers for the version filled / shaded. So, **the candidates are advised to be very careful while filling the question booklet version code in the square block and shading the circle pertaining to the same version code on the bottom portion of the OMR Answer Sheet.**

About 60 minutes after the initial TEN minutes will be given to a candidate, for filling / shading the answers on the bottom portion of the OMR answer sheet. On the bottom portion, there are 60 rows corresponding to sixty questions. Against each question number, four circles are provided corresponding to four options of the question paper. The candidate is required to fill only one circle corresponding to the correct answer. **The scanner is so sensitive to black and blue ink shades that even a slight residual ink mark or an unintended ink dot within a circle will be taken by it, as filled / shaded.** Consequently, the candidate may lose marks. Please do not make any stray pen marks on the OMR answer sheets. As the scoring done by the scanner and the computer in tandem is final, a plea for erasing or neglecting the ink mark on a circle cannot be entertained. So, **the candidates are advised to take extra precaution while filling / shading the circles on the bottom portion of the OMR Answer Sheet.**

IMPORTANT : The candidates should invariably sign on both the top and bottom portions of the OMR answer sheet, in the spaces provided for the same. The signature of the candidates on the OMR answer sheet should correspond to the signatures affixed in their 'CET 2006' application form.

THINK BEFORE YOU INK !

Once you darken a circle, there is no way to erase or to remove it. That way your decision about a correct answer will be final. The invigilator will not permit you to use marker, white fluid or any other device to hide the shading already done and you will not be supplied with one more set of OMR sheet. If you spoil a sheet in your attempt to rub off the shading done on a circle, you may ruin your opportunities. If two circles are shaded in a row and even if one of the circles is partially rubbed off, the scanner machine will take it as a multiple attempt. Therefore, think twice before you shade a circle with ink. **Darken / shade only one circle for each question as shown against the CORRECT METHOD.**

4. THE PURPOSE AND USE OF OMR ANSWER SHEETS AND THE SCANNER

The Optical Mark Reader (OMR) sheets are used in order to simplify the procedure of valuation of the answer papers and also to ensure highest accuracy. The correct and wrong answers to the objective type questions are not manually counted but are accounted for by making use of an electronic scanner. Each round spot or the circle on the OMR sheet has an alphabetical or a numerical value. So, a small mistake in shading the round spot or the circle may make a vast difference. The scanner is a highly sensitive machine and is capable of spotting any blue or black ink mark made on the OMR sheets while they pass through it. When the OMR answer sheets pass through the scanner, it identifies the filled circles and transfers the data to a computer. The scanner will only transfer the data, as it is, from the OMR answer sheets to the computer, but it will not identify the correct answers and value it.

64 OMR answer sheets corresponding to $16 \times 4 = 64$ versions containing the correct answers (KEY ANSWERS approved by the Expert Committee) will be scanned only on the last day and transferred to the computer. As a final step, the computer, which is programmed to score the correct answers and identify the wrong ones, will in the first place, score and then assign ranks.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PRESERVATION OF REPLICA OF 'CET 2006' OMR ANSWER SHEETS

The candidates who select seats through the CET Cell, should invariably preserve the 'CET 2006' OMR answer sheet replicas of all the subjects for a minimum period of one year from the date of obtaining the admission order.

5. DETERMINATION OF MERIT AND PUBLICATION OF MERIT LISTS

(A) DETERMINATION OF MERIT :

The merit of the candidates who satisfy any one of the conditions laid down under item-7 of chapter-I of the brochure will be determined as follows :

- (1) In the case of **Medical and Dental Courses**, the merit will be determined only on the basis of marks obtained by candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects taken together in the Common Entrance Test.
- (2) In the case of **Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy Courses**, the merit will be determined on the basis of marks obtained by candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Biology subjects in both Common Entrance Test and the Qualifying Examination will be taken in equal proportions.
- (3) In the case of **Engineering and Technology courses**, the merit will be determined on the basis of marks obtained by candidates in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics subjects in both Common Entrance Test and the Qualifying Examination will be taken in equal proportions.

Provided that where the merit of two or more candidates is the same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the Common Entrance Test in Biology in the case of Medical / Dental / Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses and in Mathematics in the case of Engineering / Technology courses and where the marks obtained in such cases are equal then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in Chemistry in the case of Medical / Dental / Indian Systems of Medicine and Homoeopathy courses and in Physics in the case of Engineering / Technology courses and where the marks obtained are equal again the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the marks obtained in the respective subjects in the Qualifying examination as stipulated above and where marks obtained are equal again, the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate placed above the younger.

- (4) In the case of **Architecture Course**, the merit will be determined on the basis of marks obtained by candidates in the qualifying examination in all subjects and the marks obtained in both PART – 1 & PART – 2 of the Aptitude Test will be taken in equal proportions.

Provided that where the merit of two or more candidates is same, the interse merit shall be determined with reference to the marks obtained in the aptitude test, where marks obtained in aptitude test are equal, then the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in Mathematics in the qualifying examination and where marks obtained in Mathematics are equal, the interse merit shall be determined on the basis of the age of the candidate, the elder candidate placed above the younger.

Note: If everything as specified in the provisions to sub-clauses referred to above from (1), (2), (3) & (4) are equal, then the interse merit will be determined by draw of lots.

The determination of interse merit as detailed above for selection of Government seats will be the basis for the merit list of candidates claiming benefit of reservation under Admission Rules i. e., Item 8 of Chapter – I of the brochure.

(B) PUBLICATION OF MERIT LISTS :

After the completion of the entrance test, the KEY ANSWERS will be published on **22-05-2006** on the **CET website** : <http://kar.nic.in/cet>. The candidates / parents / teachers can file their objections, if any, addressed to the Special Officer, CET Cell, Bangalore on or before **26-05-2006** either in person or through SPEED POST only, with regard to any of the published Key answers, along with all supporting documents / justifications. The objections received by the CET Cell will be placed before an **Expert Committee**, whose decision will be final for determination of the right key answers. The Key answers approved by the Expert Committee will be applied during evaluation for determination of merit order.

As per the merit determined by the CET Cell, the Medical, ISMH, Engineering and Architecture ranks will be assigned to the eligible candidates. Separate result sheets showing the Medical, ISMH, Engineering and Architecture ranks will be published on **03-06-2006** in all the 'CET 2006' examination centres and the same will also be made available on the CET Website <http://kar.nic.in/cet>. Separate merit lists in respect of the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants for the respective courses will also be prepared and published only on the CET Website. The KEY ANSWERS and the list of candidates whose results have been with-held and the reasons for with-holding the results will also be published along with the results. **Result sheets will not be displayed in the CET Cell premises nor will be published in the news papers.**

Candidates who have any objections in respect of any of the entries or problems in the result sheets, such as discrepancy / changes in the Q. E. marks, register number, version code etc., **except the marks secured in the Common Entrance Test / Aptitude Test**, can submit their objections or claims before **10-06-2006** and the with-held results of such candidates will be published on **15-06-2006**. (See box item given below about intermediary ranks / Spot ranks i.e., ranks ending with G55, G44, G33 etc.)

Request for re-totaling or revaluation will not be entertained as the valuation of the OMR answer sheets and the subsequent scoring will be error free.

What does 1234 G 55 mean ?

After the declaration of the results, the candidates may not get ranks assigned mainly for the following reasons :
1) For want of Q. E. marks, a candidate might have missed the rank. 2) A candidate might have marked the version code wrongly. 3) Q. E. marks may get varied due to revaluation or other wise, when corrected, a fresh ranking becomes necessary.

The CET computers are programmed to assign new ranks or fresh ranks to the candidates falling within the above said categories without disturbing the rank numbers assigned to the candidates whose results were declared earlier. The computer program is such that it can assign ranks in between two integers without altering the previous rank numbers. Undoubtedly, you were assigned a rank after the declaration of the results. When a rank was assigned to you, rank 1234 and 1235 had been assigned to two other candidates. When it came to assigning a rank to you, the computer found that in the normal course, your rank would have been after the rank of the candidate with rank 1234 and before the rank of the candidate with rank 1235. Therefore, the computer had to place you between 1234 and 1235.

As already said, the computer is programmed to generate large number of ranks between two integers by dividing the space alphabetically from A to Z. Then each alphabet is subdivided from 1 to 99. Now, if a new rank is required to be assigned between two integer ranks, in the first instance, the computer assigns a division number as 'G 55' before the previous rank. If one more rank needs to be assigned between the rank 1234 and 1234 G 55, the computer assigns a rank as 1234 G 44. If one more rank is to be assigned between 1234 G 55 and 1235, then it assigns a rank as 1234 G 66.

CHAPTER – III

1. DOCUMENTS TO BE PRODUCED DURING SEAT SELECTION

The original documents to be produced during seat selection have been detailed separately in respect of Special category seats (category wise) and Government seats (clause wise). They are as follows:

(A) Special Categories : Candidates claiming the benefit under special categories should produce the relevant original Special category certificates mentioned against the respective categories along with two sets of photocopies invariably on the dates notified below, to the CET Cell **ONLY IN PERSON**. They should also produce three photocopies of their 'CET 2006' admission ticket. The candidates who do not submit the special category certificates on the dates notified below will not be considered to claim eligibility under the respective special categories. **The candidates should not send their original special category documents / certificates through Post or any other private arrangement.**

The candidates who do not submit their original special category documents or certificates on the notified dates, will not be eligible for consideration of a seat under the respective Special category.

(i) **Defence :**

- (a) Candidates claiming eligibility under Clause (e) of Item – 7 of Chapter I of this brochure should produce the certificate of employment issued by the **Controlling Office** where the parent is working indicating the period during which the parent has worked in Karnataka.
- (b) Candidates claiming eligibility under Clause (f) of Item – 7 of Chapter I of this brochure should produce a certificate from the **Record Office of the Defence Unit** indicating that the parent had declared a place in Karnataka as his hometown at the time of joining the service.
- (c) Candidates claiming eligibility under Clause (g) of Item – 7 of Chapter I of this brochure should produce a certificate from the **Controlling Office** indicating the period during which the parent has worked in Karnataka, the present place of posting and also the fact that his family is permitted to stay in Karnataka.

NOTE : The candidates claiming eligibility under the sub-clauses (a) and (c) above, should produce the study certificate issued by the head of the educational institution for having studied and passed the qualifying examination in Karnataka when they come for seat selection process.

- (ii) **Ex-Defence :** Candidates claiming eligibility under Clause (h) of Item – 7 of Chapter I of this brochure should produce a certificate showing the home address of the parent issued by the **Joint Director / Deputy Director** of the concerned district and countersigned by the **Director, Department of Sainik Welfare and Resettlement, Bangalore**.
- (iii) **Anglo-Indian :** The certificate issued by the **Registered Association** of the Anglo Indian Community in the State of Karnataka.
- (iv) **NCC :** 'B' Certificate and other relevant certificates issued by the **NCC authorities** in support of the claim of the candidate.
- (v) **Sports :** The certificates issued by the **different Organizations / Federations** mentioned in **APPENDIX - IV** in support of the claim of the candidate.
- (vi) **Scouts & Guides :** The **ORIGINAL President's Award / Rashtrapati Certificate** should be submitted to the CET Cell **only on the day of Admission Round seat selection**. They need not submit the same in advance. The provisional Certificates will not be considered.
- (vii) **Persons with Physical Disability :** Candidates with physical disability ranging above 40% should produce a **medical certificate issued by the competent Doctor of a Government Hospital in Karnataka** in the field of concerned disability, only on the day of their Medical examination. The candidates suffering from hearing disability should obtain and produce a **BSER (Brain Stem Evoked Response) Audiometry report** from NIMHANS / Manipal Hospital / Government Speech and Hearing Institute (Lingarajapuram), Bangalore. The candidates claiming reservation under this category will be required to appear for Medical examination on **26-06-2006** before a Committee comprising of the Special Officer, CET Cell as the Chairman and three specialists from the Department of Orthopaedics, Ophthalmology and ENT, nominated by the Director of Medical Education, whose decision regarding the Physical disability shall be final. **The candidates with disability less than 40% will not be eligible for claiming a seat under Physically Disabled category.** The seat selection for candidates with physical disability will be held on **26-06-2006**. **The Physically Disabled candidates who fail to appear before the Committee for Medical examination on the notified date and time, will not be eligible for selection of a seat reserved under Physically Disabled category.**

(B) Government seats : Candidates who seek admission to Government seats should produce the required original documents with **ONE** set of attested photocopies of the same along with two passport size photographs and the Demand Draft for the notified fees, for verification at the CET Cell at the time of registration for seat selection. After verification, all original certificates will be returned to the candidates, for submitting the same to the college with the admission order issued by the CET Cell, while joining the college.

For the benefit of candidates, the documents to be produced for claiming a Government seat are detailed clause wise. Some of the prominent documents are detailed below :

SSLC Marks Card : SSLC or 10th standard or equivalent examination marks card.
2nd PUC Marks Card : 2nd PUC or 12th standard or qualifying examination marks card.
Study Certificate : Study Certificate to show that the candidate has studied in Karnataka for a minimum period of SEVEN years from 1st standard to 12th standard or qualifying examination issued by the Head of the institution and countersigned by the BEO or DDPI in the proforma prescribed at **PAGE - 35**.

NOTE : The CBSE and CISCE candidates should produce the study certificate obtained from the Principal of their respective schools. Further, countersignature of BEO or DDPI is not required for them.

Rural Study Certificate : Rural Study Certificate in respect of candidates claiming the benefit of rural reservation should produce a verification certificate from the concerned Tahsildar along with a rural study certificate for having studied 10 full academic years from 1st standard to 10th standard in the state of Karnataka issued by the Head of the educational institution and such certificate should be got countersigned by the BEO or DDPI in the proforma prescribed at **PAGE - 35**.

Note : The candidates whose parents come under creamy layer are not eligible to claim the benefit of rural reservation.

Kannada Medium Certificate : Kannada Medium Study Certificate in respect of candidates claiming the benefit of Kannada Medium reservation should produce the certificate for having studied 10 full academic years in Kannada medium from 1st standard to 10th standard issued by the Head of the educational institution and such certificate should be got countersigned by the BEO or DDPI of the respective Taluk / District in the proforma prescribed at **PAGE - 35**.

Caste / Caste Income Certificate: The candidates seeking reservation benefit should produce a **Caste Certificate** in form 'D' in case of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes ; in form 'E' in case of Category - 1 ; **Caste Income Certificate** in form 'F' for Other Backward Classes such as 2A, 2B, 3A and 3B, issued by the concerned Jurisdictional Tahasildar, in accordance with Government order No. SaKaE 225 BCA 2002 dated 30th March 2002, as amended from time to time.

A **separate Income Certificate** should be produced by the candidates belonging to SC, ST and Category – 1 of backward classes and the format of Income certificate is given at **PAGE - 36**. **(This is for the purpose of processing eligibility of candidates to claim Government of India scholarship).**

NOTE : Candidates claiming reservation benefit should produce a certificate indicating the Religion & Mother Tongue in accordance with the Admission register, issued by the Head of the Educational Institution from where the candidate has passed SSLC / 10th standard. They should also submit a duly sworn affidavit as per the prescribed formats given at **PAGE - 36**, along with their Caste / Caste-Income Certificate.

Please note that the school study certificates of the candidates should be got countersigned invariably by the BEO / DDPI along with full Address, Seal & Telephone Number of the concerned office. However, countersignature for the college study certificate is not required.

THE ELIGIBILITY CLAUSES FOR GOVERNMENT SEATS ARE DETAILED IN ITEM – 7 OF CHAPTER – I OF THIS BROCHURE. THE CANDIDATES HAVE TO PRODUCE ALL RELEVANT DOCUMENTS IN SUPPORT OF THE CLAUSE CLAIMED BY THEM. THE CLAUSE-WISE DETAILS ARE AS FOLLOWS :

Clause - a : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card, **Candidate's Study Certificate** and Rural Study Certificate, Kannada Medium Study Certificate, Caste / Caste Income Certificate, if applicable.

Clause - b : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card, Candidate's Study Certificate and Caste / Caste Income Certificate if applicable, along with

- 1) a certificate for either of the parent having studied for at least 7 years in Karnataka from the Head of the educational institution where he/she had studied. **(Parent's Study Certificate)**
- 2) the candidate's study certificate for having studied I & II PUC or 11th & 12th standard in Karnataka issued by the head of the educational institution. **(Candidate's Study Certificate)**

Clause - c : SSLC Marks Card & 2nd PUC Marks Card, along with

- 1) a domicile certificate issued by the concerned Revenue or Municipal Authorities certifying that the candidate has resided outside the state of Karnataka as on 01.07.2006. The place of the Issuing authority should correspond to the place of domicile of the candidate.
- 2) a domicile certificate issued by concerned Revenue Authorities of the state of Karnataka regarding the previous domicile of the parents in the state of Karnataka. The place of the Issuing authority should correspond to the place of domicile of the parent.
- 3) either of the parents 10th standard marks card, original cumulative record, candidate's Transfer Certificate or any other documentary proof in original in support of mother tongue. **(Parent's Study Certificate)**
- 4) a duly sworn declaration regarding mother tongue of the candidate. (Please see **APPENDIX - V** for the prescribed format.)

The photocopies of all the above documents pertaining to this clause should be produced compulsorily at the time of Kannada Language Test on **11-05-2006**.

Clause - d : SSLC Marks Card & 2nd PUC Marks Card, along with

- 1) a present residential certificate from the concerned Tahsildar of the respective Taluk.
- 2) either of the parents 10th standard marks card, original cumulative record or any other documentary proof in original in support of mother tongue. **(Parent's Study Certificate)**
- 3) a duly sworn declaration regarding mother tongue of the candidate. (Please see **APPENDIX - V** for the prescribed format.)

The photocopies of all the above documents pertaining to this clause should be produced compulsorily at the time of Kannada Language Test on **11-05-2006**.

Clause - e : SSLC Marks Card & 2nd PUC Marks Card, along with

- 1) the certificate for having studied II PUC or equivalent examination in Karnataka issued by the head of the educational institution. **(Candidate's Study Certificate)**
- 2) employment certificate of the parent issued by the controlling office where the parent is working indicating the period during which he has worked in Karnataka.

- Clause - f** : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card and Caste / Caste Income Certificate if applicable, along with parent's home town declaration certificate while joining the service issued by record office of the defence unit.
- Clause - g** : SSLC Marks Card & 2nd PUC Marks Card, along with
- 1) the certificate for having studied II PUC or equivalent examination in Karnataka issued by the head of the educational institution. **(Candidate's Study Certificate)**
 - 2) service certificate of the parent issued by the controlling office indicating the period during which the parent has worked in Karnataka and a certificate showing the present place of posting, indicating that his family is permitted to stay in Karnataka. **The present working place of the parent should be indicated in NAME and not by CODE NUMBERS.**
- Clause - h** : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card and Caste / Caste Income Certificate if applicable, along with the parent's home town declaration certificate while joining the service issued by Joint Director / Deputy Director of the concerned district and countersigned by Director, Department of Sainik Welfare and Resettlement, Bangalore.
- Clause - i** : SSLC Marks Card & 2nd PUC Marks Card, along with
- 1) the certificate for having studied II PUC or equivalent examination in Karnataka issued by the head of the educational institution. **(Candidate's Study Certificate)**
 - 2) a certificate from the employer indicating the parent's period of employment in Karnataka and also showing that he is transferable anywhere in India.
- Clause - j** : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card and Caste / Caste Income Certificate if applicable, along with
- 1) a certificate of the parent employee for having studied for at least 7 years in Karnataka from the Head of the educational institution where he/she had studied. **(Parent's Study Certificate)**
 - 2) home town declaration certificate of the parent employee while joining the service, showing that he is transferable anywhere in India issued by the employer.
- Clause - k** : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card and Caste / Caste Income Certificate if applicable, along with a certificate showing that the parent is / was a Member of Parliament elected from Karnataka issued by the Parliament Secretariat.
- Clause - l** : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card and Caste / Caste Income Certificate if applicable, along with a certificate from the Principal Secretary / Deputy Secretary / Under Secretary, DPAR, Government of Karnataka, Bangalore where the parent belongs to All India Service of Karnataka cadre stating that the parent is a member of such All India Cadre. The certificate should also indicate the period during which he has served or is serving outside the state of Karnataka and if the parent is a State Government Employee, a certificate from the concerned Head of the Department or the Head of the Office where such parent is employed should be produced.
- Clause - m** : SSLC Marks Card, 2nd PUC Marks Card along with a certificate (IDENTITY CARD) issued by the jurisdictional "District Magistrate and Deputy Commissioner" of any state in India, as the proof of migration.

- NOTE** : 1. Where the eligibility of the candidate is based on the study, employment, etc., of the parent, relevant documents to establish the relationship of the candidate with the parent has to be produced.
2. The contents of the documents submitted by the candidates should be either in Kannada or English languages only. If the documents are in any other official language, the same should be got translated to Kannada or English language through the concerned authorities with signature & seal and should be produced during seat selection. Otherwise the CET Cell reserves the right to reject the same.

2. ADMISSION FEE

The admission fee for the Medical, Dental, Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy, Engineering, Technology and Architecture courses, as notified by the Government will be published on the notice boards of the CET Cell and also on the CET website <http://kar.nic.in/cet> before the commencement of seat selection process.

The fee amount notified by the Government for different courses / categories should be paid by all the candidates when they come for seat selection, in the form of a Demand Draft drawn in favour of **"The Special Officer, CET Cell, Bangalore"**, payable at Bangalore. The candidates should come prepared with the demand drafts before registering themselves for selecting a seat, failing which they will not be allowed to register and select any seat. **The candidates are advised not to bring the notified fee in the form of CASH, as the Bank counter functioning at the CET Cell premises will not issue the demand drafts.**

3. GOVERNMENT SEATS (SEAT MATRIX)

The CET Cell will come to know about the exact number of seats, their classification and categories before the commencement of seat selection. Hence, an accurate number of seats to be offered for allotment as Government seats, college wise, category wise and course wise, cannot be made known at this stage. The seat matrix (Government seats) in respect of Medical, Dental, Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy, Engineering, Technology and Architecture courses, as notified by the Government will be published on the notice boards of the CET Cell and also on the CET website <http://kar.nic.in/cet> before the commencement of seat selection process. For the benefit of candidates, full postal address and telephone numbers of the Government, University and Private Aided professional colleges and the total intake of seats falling to the share of the Government for the year 2005-06 are given in **APPENDIX – VI**.

4. PROCEDURE OF SEAT SELECTION BY THE CANDIDATES

Selection of a seat by a candidate and admission thereafter at the CET Cell shall comprise of the following stages :

(a) Registration of the candidate ; (b) Verification of the original documents ; (c) Exercising the option by candidates (Selection of seats in accordance with merit order) ; (d) Remittance of Fees in the form of Demand Draft and (e) Issue of Admission Order.

The said activities have been divided into **an Admission round seat selection followed by a Casual Vacancy round seat selection**. Many candidates would have secured ranks in Medical / ISMH / Engineering / Architecture disciplines. Having selected a seat in Medical / Dental / Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy courses, a candidate may change his mind and opt for an Engineering / Technology / Architecture seat. This leads to a Medical / Dental / Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy seat falling vacant and vice-versa is also true. In order to take care of such changes, flexibility has been built into the system by dividing the entire process into an Admission round followed by a Casual Vacancy round. **In both rounds, the candidates will be allowed to exercise option and to select a seat of their choice strictly in the order of merit.**

A day is divided into four sessions and the first session begins at 8.00 am. **The candidates will be allowed to participate in accordance with the notified time schedule and as per the stipulated rank ranges only.** The candidates are required to register themselves in the first counter where their CET number is entered into the computer system. From there, the candidates are sent to the Verification Counter where the entries of original documents are checked against the computer data that would have been furnished by them in their application forms. After verification, the CET Cell will retain only the attested photocopies and the original documents will be returned to the candidates for depositing the same to the concerned colleges.

The entire seat selection activities in the CET Cell are controlled by a computer system right from the stage of registration till the stage of printing of admission orders. The highly sophisticated software used in the system has the ability on one side to control the initial registration, provide data for verification of the original documents and on the other side to take care of the selection of seats by the candidates in the order of merit, payment of fees and finally printing of admission orders. As already said, **once the candidate comes to the seat selection hall by registering and verifying the documents, the computer will not allow to jump the order of merit.** Even if one had registered himself before another candidate with better merit, he will have to wait for his turn at the admission terminals. Unless a candidate who has better rank and whose CET number is registered gets the opportunity to select a seat, a candidate who has a rank next to him cannot think of by-passing him. He has the assistance of a huge on-line projector screen, which will show category-wise, course-wise and college-wise availability of seats at that moment. **At this point, the candidate should produce the demand draft for the prescribed fee amount, failing which he will not be allowed to exercise his option.** The moment he exercises his option, the computer display / projector screen will show one seat less against the course / college from which the candidate has selected the seat.

After seat selection, the candidate will have to go to the Bank counter and deposit the demand draft for the prescribed fee. The Bank Officer can enter the amount only if the candidate has selected a seat, otherwise the computer at the Bank counter will not allow him to do so. Once the amount is properly entered against the name of the candidate in the Bank counter, a printer automatically prints the admission order at the other end.

5. EXERCISING OF OPTION BY THE CANDIDATES AND ADMISSION

In accordance with Admission rules, the seat selection comprises of an Admission Round followed by a Casual Vacancy Round for casual vacancies, if any. **The candidates who have obtained a seat in the previous years in any discipline through the CET Cell, will not be eligible for selection of a seat in the same discipline during this year.** For example, the candidates who have selected a Medical seat in the previous years, will not be eligible for selecting a Medical seat again this year. However, they will be eligible for selecting a Dental / Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy / Engineering / Architecture seat. Similarly, Dental to Dental, Engineering to Engineering, Architecture to Architecture etc. is also not permitted. **Such candidates who select seats in the other discipline during this year, will forfeit the seat already selected during previous years.**

(A) ADMISSION ROUND SEAT SELECTION

The admission round will be held in SIX stages and all eligible candidates will be allowed to participate in the same. The candidates who have selected or not selected a seat and those who have reported or not reported to the colleges, are also eligible to participate in the admission round of seat selection process. The SIX stages of Admission Round Seat Selection are as follows :

- STAGE – 1 : For Special category seats i.e., Persons with Physical disability, N.C.C. and Sports.
- STAGE – 2 : For the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants.
- STAGE – 3 : For Medical and Dental courses.
- STAGE – 4 : For Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Unani and Naturopathy & Yoga courses.
- STAGE – 5 : For Engineering and Technology courses.
- STAGE – 6 : For Architecture course.

In all the six stages of the admission round stated above, the eligible candidates will be allowed to select the seats in the order of merit, as per the schedule given in **APPENDIX – VII**. The candidates who select a seat in this round, should invariably pay the prescribed fee in the form of Demand Draft and should obtain the admission order for the seat selected. **The candidates who do not bring the prescribed fee on the day of seat selection will not be allowed to select any seat.** The fee paid by candidates during the Admission round for one discipline / course will be adjusted upon selection of a seat in the other disciplines in both Admission round / Casual vacancy round.

STAGE – 1 : FOR SPECIAL CATEGORIES :

In the first instance, seats reserved for Special Categories in respect of Medical, Dental, Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Unani, Naturopathy & Yoga, Engineering and Technology courses will be offered for the following :

- (a) Candidates falling under persons with Physical disability on **26-06-2006** ;
 - (b) Candidates falling under NCC on **27-06-2006 & 28-06-2006** and
 - (c) Candidates falling under Sports on **29-06-2006 & 30-06-2006**.
- (a) The candidates claiming a seat under the persons with disability category should **COMPULSORILY** appear before the Medical Board constituted by the Director of Medical Education, consisting of the Special Officer and three specialists. The Medical Board shall examine the candidate on **26-06-2006 at 10.30 a.m.** and certify regarding the percentage of disability and the decision of the Medical Board shall be final. **The candidates with less than 40% of disability and the candidates who fail to appear before the Committee on the notified date & time, will not be eligible for selection of a seat under the persons with disability category.**
- (b) Among the NCC candidates, the candidates who are adjudged overall All India Best Cadet with Gold / Silver / Bronze medal in the R D Camp held at New Delhi will be considered first. Candidates who have won Gold / Silver / Bronze medal in the All India TSC (Boys) / TSC (Girls) / NSC / VSC will be considered second. Candidates who have participated in the Youth Exchange Programmes and Foreign Naval Cruise will be considered THIRD. Candidates who have participated from Karnataka

in the R D Camp will be considered FOURTH. Candidates who have participated from Karnataka in the All India TSC (Boys) / TSC (Girls) / NSC / VSC will be considered FIFTH. Candidates who have participated in the Mountaineering, Sailing, Motor Cycle and Cycling Expeditions will be considered SIXTH. Candidates who have participated in NIC, Trekking, Mountaineering, BLC, ALC, RCTC and Army, Navy, Air Force & Hospital Attachment camps will be considered SEVENTH. Candidates who possess only 'B' certificate will be considered EIGHTH. For all the above said categories, possession of 'B' Certificate is compulsory. While considering the medal status for First and Second preferences, priority will be Gold to Silver and Silver to Bronze. The candidates who have only 'B' certificate will be considered along with GM candidates, in accordance with the CET Ranking in the general round of seat selection and such candidates will not be allowed to select seats on the day of Special category NCC seat selection.

(c) Among the Sports category candidates, the candidates who have won Gold, Silver and Bronze medals in Super – A games will be considered FIRST. Medal winners in A – games will be considered second. Medal winners in B – games and participant in Super – A or A - games will be considered third. Candidates who have won Gold, Silver and Bronze medals in B – games will be considered fourth. Among the Sports candidates in each group, the Medals won by the candidates in the events OR games of Sports will also be considered. Priority will be Gold to Silver and Silver to Bronze, irrespective of number of medals. The candidates who have only participated in B – games will be considered along with GM candidates, in accordance with the CET Ranking in the general round of seat selection and such candidates will not be allowed to select seats on the day of Special category Sports seat selection.

STAGE – 2 : FOR THE WARDS OF JAMMU & KASHMIRI MIGRANTS :

The Medical, Dental, Engineering / Technology & Architecture seats reserved in respect of the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants will be offered in this stage at once on **01-07-2006**. All eligible candidates including the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants who have selected seats in STAGE – 1 will be eligible for participating in this stage of admission round in accordance with their **Medical / Engineering / Architecture ranks**. The seat selected in the earlier STAGE, if any, shall stand automatically cancelled, if the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants selects a seat in this STAGE.

STAGE – 3 : FOR MEDICAL AND DENTAL COURSES :

The Medical and Dental courses seats pertaining to all reserved and General merit category candidates will be offered in this stage at once. All eligible candidates including the candidates who have selected a seat in STAGES – 1 & 2, will be eligible for participating in this stage of admission round in accordance with their **Medical ranks**. Seat selected in the earlier STAGE, if any, shall stand automatically cancelled, if a candidate selects a seat in this STAGE.

STAGE – 4 : FOR AYURVEDA, HOMOEOPATHY, UNANI, NATUROPATHY & YOGA COURSES :

The Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Unani, Naturopathy and Yoga courses seats pertaining to all reserved and General merit category candidates will be offered in this stage at once. All eligible candidates including the candidates who have selected seats in STAGES – 1, 2 & 3, will be eligible for participating in this stage of admission round in accordance with their **ISMH ranks**. Seat selected in the earlier STAGES, if any, shall stand automatically cancelled, if a candidate selects a seat in this STAGE.

STAGE – 5 : FOR ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY COURSES :

The Engineering and Technology courses seats pertaining to all reserved and General merit categories will be offered in this stage at once. All eligible candidates including the candidates who have selected seats in STAGES – 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be eligible for participating in this stage of admission round in accordance with their **Engineering ranks**. The seat selected in the earlier STAGES, if any, shall stand automatically cancelled, if a candidate selects a seat in this STAGE.

STAGE – 6 : FOR ARCHITECTURE COURSE :

The Architecture course seats pertaining to all reserved and General merit categories will be offered in this stage at once. All eligible candidates including the candidates who have selected seats in STAGES – 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 will be eligible for participating in this stage of admission round in accordance with their **Architecture ranks**. The seat selected in the earlier STAGES, if any, shall stand automatically cancelled, if a candidate selects a seat in this STAGE.

NOTE : IN ALL THE ABOVE STAGES, THE CANDIDATES BELONGING TO RESERVED CATEGORIES SUCH AS SC, ST, CAT – 1, 2A, 2B, 3A, 3B, RURAL & KANNADA MEDIUM WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY OF SELECTING A SEAT UNDER GENERAL MERIT CATEGORY ALSO.

IMPORTANT : The candidates who select a seat in the Admission Round, should report to the respective colleges along with the original admission order issued by the CET Cell, well within the last date prescribed in their admission orders.

(B) CASUAL VACANCY ROUND SEAT SELECTION

After the completion of admission round seat selection, the unfilled / surrendered / forfeited / cancelled / newly added seats, if any, will be offered as “Casual Vacancies”. All candidates who have selected a seat and obtained admission orders in respect of the seat selected in the admission round whether reported to the college or not, will be eligible to participate in the Casual Vacancy round along with all those candidates who have not selected any seat in any of the stages in the admission round.

A candidate who selects a Medical / Dental seat in the Casual Vacancy round will not be eligible for participating in the subsequent stages of Casual Vacancy round for other disciplines. Likewise, a candidate who selects an ISM & Homoeopathy seat during Casual Vacancy round will not be eligible for participating in the Engineering / Technology / Architecture Casual Vacancy rounds and a candidate who selects an Engineering / Technology seat during Casual Vacancy round will not be eligible for participating in the Architecture Casual Vacancy round. The candidates who select casual vacancy seats should invariably report to the respective colleges along with all original documents and the admission order issued by the CET Cell, well within the last date prescribed in the admission order, for that discipline.

Provided that the candidates who have selected Medical / Dental seat in the admission round and who wants to opt for Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy or Engineering / Technology or Architecture seats, should invariably surrender the Medical / Dental seat either before the commencement of Medical / Dental casual vacancy round or before the turn of such candidate in the Medical / Dental casual vacancy round. Provided further that the candidates who have selected Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy seat in the admission round and who wants to opt for Engineering / Technology or Architecture seats, should invariably surrender the Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy seat either before the commencement of Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy casual vacancy round or before the turn of such candidate in the Indian System of Medicine and Homoeopathy casual vacancy round. This proviso is also applicable for the Casual vacancy rounds for Engineering / Technology and Architecture courses.

PROCEDURE OF CONVERSION OF SEATS IN THE CASUAL VACANCY ROUND

After completion of the admission round, the seats that remain unfilled under all the Rural and Kannada medium quota of the reserved categories will be converted to General of the respective reserved categories and offered only to the reserved category candidates. (SCR & SCK to SCG, STR & STK to STG, 1R & 1K to 1G, 2AR & 2AK to 2AG, 2BR & 2BK to 2BG, 3AR & 3AK to 3AG, 3BR & 3BK to 3BG.) Thereafter, the seats that remain unfilled under various reserved General categories such as SCG, STG, 1G, 2AG, 2BG, 3AG, 3BG, GMR and GMK, along with unfilled special category seats will be converted to the General Merit category and offered to GM category candidates along with all other category candidates. This procedure of conversion of seats, will be adopted before the commencement of Casual vacancy round seat selection with regard to all the disciplines. However, the consequential reserved category vacancies that arise during the Casual Vacancy Round will remain under the same categories and will be offered thereafter to the candidates belonging to the respective reserved categories.

The Casual vacancy round seat selection process will be held in accordance with the schedule given in **APPENDIX – VII**. The different stages of Casual Vacancy Round Seat Selection are as follows :

STAGE – 1 : FOR MEDICAL AND DENTAL COURSES :

The Casual vacancies, if any, in the Medical and Dental courses will be offered in this stage in the first instance to Physically Disabled, NCC & Sports Special category candidates followed by the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants followed by all reserved category candidates. The seats that remain unfilled under all reserved and special categories will be converted to General Merit category and offered thereafter to GM candidates along with all other category candidates. If the candidate selects a seat in this STAGE, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled.

STAGE – 2 : FOR AYURVEDA, HOMOEOPATHY, UNANI, NATUROPATHY & YOGA COURSES :

The Casual vacancies, if any, in the Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Unani, Naturopathy and Yoga courses will be offered in this stage in the first instance to Physically Disabled, NCC & Sports Special category candidates followed by all reserved category candidates. The seats that remain unfilled under all reserved and special categories will be converted to General Merit category and offered thereafter to GM candidates along with all other category candidates. If the candidate selects a seat in this STAGE, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled.

STAGE – 3 : FOR ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY COURSES :

The Casual vacancies, if any, in the Engineering / Technology courses will be offered in this stage in the first instance to Physically Disabled, NCC & Sports Special category candidates followed by the wards of Jammu & Kashmiri migrants followed by all reserved category candidates. The seats that remain unfilled under all reserved and special categories will be converted to General Merit category and offered thereafter to GM candidates along with all other category candidates. If the candidate selects a seat in this STAGE, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled.

STAGE – 4 : FOR ARCHITECTURE COURSE :

The Casual vacancies, if any, in the Architecture course will be offered in this stage in the first instance to all reserved category candidates. The seats that remain unfilled under the reserved categories will be converted to General Merit category and offered thereafter to GM candidates along with all other category candidates. If the candidate selects a seat in this STAGE, the seat selected earlier shall automatically stand cancelled.

A NOTE ON REFUND AND FORFEITURE OF FEE

1. In the case of a candidate who cancels / surrenders the seat selected in the Admission round, before the turn of such candidate in the Casual Vacancy round, the Special Officer, CET Cell shall forfeit 20% of the fee paid and refund the remaining 80% to the candidate.
2. In the case of a candidate who cancels / surrenders the seat after such candidate's turn in the Casual Vacancy round, the Special Officer, CET Cell shall forfeit 100% of the fee paid.
3. The fee paid in the Casual Vacancy round, will not be liable to be refunded, in case of cancellation / surrender of the same by the candidate. A candidate who selects a casual vacancy seat and does not join the college concerned shall not be entitled for refund of deposited fees, which shall be forfeited by the Special Officer, CET Cell.
4. In the case of a candidate who does not surrender, cancels or fails to join the college / course allotted, even after the completion of the Casual Vacancy round, the Special Officer, CET Cell shall forfeit the entire amount paid as fees by the concerned candidate.
5. **In the case of a candidate who claims the refund with regard to the excess fee remitted by him should claim such an amount on or before 31-03-2007, failing which, the Special Officer, CET Cell shall forfeit such excess fee amount paid by the concerned candidate.**
