MPHIL PSYCHIATRIC SOCIAL WORK: Admissions are made on the basis of selection test consisting of departmental written test and a personal interview.

WRITTEN TEST PATTERN - The test consists of 80 multiple choice questions covering a wide range of topics from various branches of Social work such as historical beginnings of the discipline, basic social work concepts, dynamics of human behaviour, working with individuals and groups, family and child welfare, women welfare, community welfare, psychiatric social work, industrial psychology, statistics & research methodology. All questions carry equal marks. The test performance will carry a maximum of 70 points. The duration of the entrance test is 90 minutes.

INTERVIEW - Based on the performance in the written test, the first 12 candidates will be called for the interview. The interview performance will carry a maximum of 10 points. The candidates are required to produce all the original certificates during the selection test.

SELECTION TEST

- The test will be held at Manipal College of Nursing, Manipal at 9 a m on 09.07.06 for MPhil Nursing. Shortlisted candidates must also attend the interview on 10.07.06 at 3 p m.
- The test will be held in the Department of Clinical Psychology, Kasturba Medical College and Hospital, Manipal at 9 a m on 24.07.06 for MPhil Clinical Psychology. Shortlisted candidates must also attend the interview on 25.07.06.
- The test will be held in the Department of Psychiatry, Kasturba Medical College and Hospital, Manipal at 9 a m on 24.07.06 for MPhil Psychiatric Social Work. Shortlisted candidates must also attend the interview on 25.07.06.

HALL TICKET

The Hall Ticket will be despatched only by Certificate of Posting or Business Mail so as to reach the candidates by 01.07.06 for MPhil

Nursing and 15.07.06 for other courses. In case the Hall Ticket is not received by the above date, the candidate should follow the procedure given in Section 05 to obtain a Duplicate Hall Ticket.

MERIT LIST

The list of candidates provisionally selected for admission will be displayed on notice board of MAHE on 10.07.06 for MPhil Nursing and 25.07.06 for other courses, after the interview.

All the selected candidates are required to pay the full fees and submit all their original documents on or before 01.08.06.

CLASSES

The classes will commence from 16.08.06 (01.09.06 for MPhil Nursing).

PhD Programmes

DURATION

1. The duration of the program will be from the time of registration to submission of thesis.
2. The minimum duration for the postgraduate qualified full time PhD candidates shall be 3 years. The maximum duration shall not exceed 6 years which will be based on the recommendation from the doctoral committee.
3. The minimum duration for the postgraduate qualified part time PhD candidates shall be 4 years. The maximum duration shall not exceed 7 years which will be based on the recommendation from the doctoral committee.
4. Under exceptional circumstances, a candidate with MBBS or BE may be accepted for registering for PhD provided candidate has
 - a) atleast two research publications in indexed journals.
 - b) worked in a specific area of research
5. The minimum duration for the MBBS/BE candidates who intend to register for full time PhD shall be 4 years and for part time candidates 5 years.
6. The minimum duration for candidates with MPhil qualification (in addition to postgraduate qualification shall be):
 - a) 2 years in the case of full time candidates and
 - b) 3 years in the case of part time candidates.
7. The candidates should work under the direct supervision of the guide for a minimum period of 180 working days during the stipulated period of course work.

ELIGIBILITY

A candidate seeking admission to the course of study leading to the award of a degree of Doctor of Philosophy must possess at least one of the following qualifications:

1. A masters degree in the respective subject with first class.
However the requirement of first class is not mandatory for MAHE teachers who are intending to do part time PhD.
2. A degree in MPhil in the respective subject.
3. Master of Surgery or Doctor of Medicine or Master of Dental Sciences or Master of Nursing Sciences or any other Master's degree in respective allied health subjects.
4. Candidates accepted for PhD course in advanced centres of Scientific Research which are recognized by MAHE for joint academic programmes will be permitted to register for PhD degree of MAHE.
5. Any other modification in eligibility criteria will be accepted, if recommended by the Academic Senate of MAHE.

ADMISSIONS

Admission to MAHE PhD programme will be done on the following basis:

1. Whenever University faculty members have research grants, with provision for selecting the research students, the faculty member holding the grant will select the candidates who have passed UGC/CSIR examination after evaluating the suitability of the candidate.
2. A candidate may carry out his/her research in the appropriate department of the University for conducting his/her research, depending upon the type of the project he/she wishes to undertake.
3. A candidate may also register to do his/her PhD work either in the interdisciplinary subject and/or allied subjects in the appropriate department of the University for conducting his/her research, depending upon the type of the project he/she wishes to undertake.
4. MAHE employees who seek admission to a PhD program must submit their application through their Head of Institution.
5. Research Scholars sponsored by funding agencies must submit their application along with a synopsis of the project and details of funding.

6. Candidates applying under University approved scholarship/fellowship programs must submit a copy of their scholarship /fellowship approval along with their application.

7. Candidates intending to carry out research in collaborative research centres must submit a no objection letter from the appropriate authority of such centre. A list of such collaborative research centres is given below:

FEES

1. All candidates admitted to the PhD programme in a MAHE institution will be required to pay the University registration fee and such other fees as may be prescribed by the university.

3. Candidate registered with a collaborative research centre will be governed by the schedule of fee applicable to that centre. Such candidates will be required to pay only the prescribed university registration fee and the thesis fee.

4. Candidates who require consumable such as chemicals, reagents, solvents, etc for their research will be charged for the use of such consumables.

5. Financial clearance from student finance office: A candidate who has completed the PhD programme must submit to the office of the Registrar a dues clearance certificate from the University student finance office while applying for the issue of the degree certificate

EXECUTION OF SERVICE AGREEMENT

1. The following categories of candidates will be required to execute service agreement to serve the University or any of the institutions of the Manipal group:

i. MAHE employees who have been granted sabbatical leave or leave of absence with service credit.

ii. Candidates who have been sponsored by MAHE or by any of its constituent colleges/centres.

iii. Candidates who have been selected under any of MAHE approved scholarship/fellowship programme.

iv. Candidates in whose cases, a service agreement has been made mandatory by their funding agency. (In such cases, the funding agency will specify the institution/s the candidates are liable to serve).

2. The agreement to serve may be for 2 years or such extended period as may be required in each case.

Oral Implantology

Dental implant treatment has been one of the most recent success stories of dentistry. It has become the integral part of mainstream dentistry and has opened new frontiers of research in the dental profession. It is therefore incumbent on dentists to extend quality implant therapy.

The development of dental implants has been very rapid over the last few decades with a volcanic growth in the number of dentists promoting implant practice globally. In our country too, implantology has made inroads, luring many practitioners to diversify into this emerging field but their treatment proved to be largely unpredictable and with dubious scientific foundation. The reason for this mayhem is lack of an intensive academic background, supported by sound surgical and clinical hands-on practice in implant dentistry. The range of applications, protocol variations, the complexity of implant system and related management have all increased dramatically over the last decade and this may be bewildering to the newcomer to implant dentistry. Although the demand for implant dentistry has increased, the number of trained implantologists could not supplement this. This problem is compounded by lack of institutes, which could impart training in this field.

This well structured scientifically sound course saw its inception in the year 2000 and ever since has received overwhelming response from dentists in India and abroad. This novel course was a collaborative effort of two organizations, which are attributed to as the "cream organizations" in their respective sector. These are Manipal College of Dental Sciences, Manipal and Friadent GmbH of Germany.

The course commences by providing a firm grasp of the underlying surgical, biomedical and physiologic principles so that the latest "cutting edge" developments can be appreciated. The practitioners are involved with all the aspects of implant dentistry namely the prosthodontic, surgical, restorative and periodontal fundamentals so that a practical understanding of the entire process is obtained over a period of one year through five contact sessions each of one week duration. In adjunct to this, individual home task makes it an enjoyable, innovative and progressive learning experience.

When implants were introduced as an effective treatment modality, their efficacy was limited by the amount of available bone and traditional implant dentistry required man months and many visits before function and esthetics are restored. Therefore, we also speculate of widening the horizons of our course by adopting the advancements in implantology such as various bone augmentation procedures using chin grafts, bioactive glass practicles; immediate loading of implants etc.

Dental implant treatment is an integral part of mainstream dentistry, perhaps the most researched discipline in the dental profession. It is therefore incumbent on dentists to extend quality implant therapy. Dentists have to work in close co-ordination with the surgeon and the patient as therapeutic procedure demands dedication to achieve the best result. We, at the Manipal College of Dental Sciences (MCOODS), Manipal, strive for that best possible result by supporting our colleagues with educational programmes and high quality surgical care.

The department with its state of the art oral implantology training facility specializes in the care of patients who are in need of dental implants and other oral surgery procedures. This unique course started in the year 2001 in collaboration with the academic division of Friadent GmbH of Germany, the department offers both educational and treatment facilities. The programme is to spread greater awareness and integral knowledge on dental implantology therapy among dentists and provide specialized facilities to patients.

In most cases, we arrange for consultation appointment prior to any treatment except in emergency or urgent situations. We take pride in the quality of care we give both technical and personal. One can expect to be treated in a professional, caring and friendly manner by everyone in our department.

This oral surgery facility is unique in that we have a fully functional top quality dental laboratory and work closely in co-ordination with other dental specialists in our department. This gives us greater opportunity to deliver comprehensive care in a convenient environment to our patients.

The certificate course in implantology introduced by MCOODS is elaborate. It is a well structured, systematic, continuing dental

education, combining in-campus and intensive hands-on experience with distance education.

Until now, such extended, comprehensive, one year training facility at university level is not available in India. It is likely that MCODS could be the first center to offer a formal training facility to dentists in developing the required competence for a highly specialized segment of dentistry and grant certificate to participants after completing the course successfully.

MCODS has adopted a holistic approach to the training programme. It has selected specialists from the departments of prosthodontics, oral surgery and periodontics. The diagnosis and treatment planning concepts are largely prosthodontics centered. The syllabus and curriculum for the course are jointly designed by in-house and overseas experts, predominantly keeping in mind the interests of dentists, patients and our country.

The department is fully equipped with the state of the art surgical equipment, instruments and augmentation materials. All laboratory work can be carried out at our own prosthodontics and implant services laboratory, where the course is being conducted.

DURATION

The course is of one year duration. It is a combination of 4 to 5 contact sessions conducted at Manipal and learning experience at candidates' own work place in between the sessions. Each contact session is of one week duration.

COURSE CONTENTS

The intensive five week training is mainly designed for experienced practitioners who wish to learn and incorporate the established principles and protocols of implantology therapy safely in their existing practice. They will be taught the principles and methods of patient assessment, treatment planning, implant selection criteria, and surgical, restorative treatment protocol to achieve optimum functional and cosmetic results as per clinical needs of each individual patient.

Didactic component will also include basic science subjects to comprehensively cover all the aspects of implantology. After the

completion of pre-clinical training and laboratory procedures, candidates will take up clinical cases. Along with implant placement they will also learn to place appropriate prosthetics superstructures and complete their assignment of placing a minimum of 24 implants. They are also expected to complete other relevant assignments and subjects themselves to a formal evaluation process. On successful completion of their assignments and tests, they would be presented with the certificate of training.

CONTACT SESSIONS

Selected students will meet at MCODS, Manipal as per the pre-determined schedule, 4-5 times in one year. Each meeting will last for about a week. They will have to observe and imbibe the intricacies of implant dentistry and take up intensive hands-on training along with clinical cases. The learning process will be kept active throughout the programme by constantly interacting with faculty members from Manipal.

DRESS CODE

All candidates must wear white clothing during surgical sessions throughout the contact programme. The clothing is not formal surgical gowns, but decent white dress including trousers. It is therefore, advisable to carry sufficient number of clothes whenever contact sessions are being conducted here.

SCHEDULE OF CONTACT SESSIONS

The above dates are subject to change in case of necessity. The period in between contact sessions will be utilized for executing clinical procedures. But, before taking up their minimum assignments of diagnosis, treatment and prosthetic plans, candidates will have to obtain prior approval from the training centre.

ELIGIBILITY

Preference will be given to BDS degree holders from a college recognized by the Dental Council of India and should have a minimum of 3 years of general practice. Candidates with MDS degree (any clinical speciality) are also eligible for the course.

All candidates must ensure that they fulfill the prescribed eligibility norms. Admissions are subject to verification of authenticity of their certificates/ documents. The decision of the university will be final regarding the eligibility of the applicant.

ADMISSIONS

Admissions are made based on merit and experience of the candidate in the relevant area.

FEE STRUCTURE

Fee structure is based on self financing concept. Payment should be made lump sum at the time of enrolment by demand draft in favour of MAHE, payable at Manipal or Udupi or Bangalore.

The total fees for the entire course is Rs.2,80,000 (USD 10,000 for Foreign/NRI candidates) which includes accommodation and food during the contact sessions. The accommodation is provided at Hotel Valley View International, Manipal whenever possible or at a similar facility in the neighbourhood on a twin sharing basis. The fees also includes the supply of course material, access to all academic facilities, laboratory services (for the final restoration of the implants placed in the department only) and all clinical facilities during the contact sessions. However, it will not cover the cost of prosthetic superstructures for implants. Candidates are expected to procure them on their own.

As part of the training programme, candidates will have to provide implants and above mentioned prosthetic parts to recipients free of cost.

In addition to the above mentioned fees, candidates are required to pay Rs.3,500 (USD 300 for Foreign/NRI) towards registration and Rs.7,500 towards caution deposit (refundable after completion of the course).

WITHDRAWALS AND REFUND

No refunds or withdrawals will be permitted under any circumstances as the course is a self financing training programme.

All enrolled candidates are required to equip themselves with the following instruments and kits and bring them along for use during the contact sessions:

ATTENDANCE

It is mandatory to have 100 per cent attendance during all contact sessions. Each candidate must complete the specified assignment in time and strictly adhere to submission schedule.

EVALUATION

The performance evaluation will be done on the basis of satisfactory completion of all assignments and the number of implants placed in the patient's mouth, followed by an examination at the end of the training.

The certificate will be awarded after taking into consideration the criteria listed below:

1. Written test on theoretical aspects for 30% marks.
2. Oral exam 20%.
3. Candidate's clinical treatment report as per the evaluation done by the supervising staff: 20%.
4. Presentation of written report of treatment as given by candidate by using standard form: 15%.
5. Presentation of typed copy of the scientific review of publications on a specific aspect of oral implantology: 15%.

All the stages of evaluation process are equally important for the successful completion of the course. Failure to undertake any one of the aspects mentioned above will disqualify the candidate from obtaining the certificate.

Candidates, who fall short of the minimum requirement to obtain the certificate, will be allowed to repeat their performance in the failed subject/paper, provided it is undertaken within a period of one year of the completion of the course. They need not repeat all the stages of evaluation process.

CLINICAL ASSIGNMENTS AND HOME TASKS

Candidates will have to:

- Present seminars
- Organise paper case discussions
- Undertake diagnosis, treatment planning and clinical procedures for placing a minimum of 24 implants, including prosthetic superstructures
- Other assignments, if any

Participants will have to take up the following types of cases:

Each candidate will have to treat a minimum of 10 patients and place at least 24 implants. The department would provide patient's for 50% of the implants, which are to be placed by the students; they will place the rest of the implants as home task in their respective clinics.

AWARD OF CERTIFICATES

Certificate of training will be issued jointly by the Manipal College of Dental Sciences and MAHE to successful candidates at the close of the one year of training programme. However, candidates will have to finish their assignments and have full attendance.

Fee structure is based on self financing concept. Payment should be made lump sum at the time of enrolment by demand draft in favour of MAHE, payable at Manipal or Udupi or Bangalore.

The total sum of fee for the entire course is Rs.2,00,000 (USD 8,000 for Foreign/NRI candidates) includes accommodation (boarding is not included) during the contact sessions. The accommodation is provided at Hotel Valley View International, Manipal whenever possible, or at a similar facility in the neighbourhood on a twin sharing basis.

The fee also includes the supply of course material, access to all academic facilities, laboratory services (for the final restoration of patients treated in the department only) and all clinical facilities during the contact sessions.

In addition to the above mentioned fees, candidates are required to pay Rs. 3,500 (USD 300 for Foreign/NRI) towards registration and Rs.7,500 towards caution deposit (refundable after completion of the course).

WITHDRAWALS AND REFUND

No refunds or withdrawals will be permitted under any circumstances as the course is a self financing training programme.

ATTENDANCE

It is mandatory to have 100 per cent attendance during all contact sessions. Each candidate must complete the specified assignment in time and strictly adhere to submission schedule.

EVALUATION

The performance evaluation will be done on the basis of satisfactory completion of all assignments, followed by an examination at the end of the training.

The certificate will be awarded after taking into consideration the three criteria listed below:

Candidates will have to take up written test on theoretical aspects for 50% marks;

Candidate's clinical treatment report as per the evaluation done by the supervising staff - 30%;

Presentation of typed copy of the scientific review of publications on a specific aspect of Aesthetic Dentistry - 20%.

All three stages of evaluation process are equally important for the successful completion of the course. Failure to undertake any one of the three aspects will disqualify the candidate from obtaining the certificate.

Candidates, who fall short of the minimum requirement to obtain the certificate, will be allowed to repeat their performance in the failed subject/paper, provided he or she undertakes the test within a period of one year of the completion of the course. Failed candidates need not repeat all stages of evaluation process.

AWARD OF CERTIFICATES

Certificate of training will be issued jointly by the Manipal College of Dental Sciences and MAHE to successful candidates at the close of the one-year of training programme. However, candidates will have to finish their assignments and have full attendance.

HALL TICKET

Hall Ticket will be issued only to those eligible candidates who have submitted the application forms complete in all respects on or before the last date mentioned for the respective courses.

The candidates must not mutilate the Hall Ticket or change any entry made therein after it has been authenticated and received by them. No candidate will be permitted to write the test without a valid Hall Ticket.

The Hall Ticket is not transferable to any other person. Impersonation is a legally punishable offence.

The Hall Ticket will be despatched only by certificate of posting or business mail. Hall Tickets will NOT be sent by fax or email.

Hall Ticket is an important document. It must be preserved and produced at the time of counselling/admission.

The Hall Ticket will indicate the hall ticket number, course/s applied, address of the Test Centre and Test Schedule allotted to the candidate. Discrepancies, if any, must be brought to our notice immediately.

DUPLICATE HALL TICKET

In case the Hall Ticket is not received by the date mentioned separately for each course, then the candidates must follow the following steps:

ALLOTMENT OF TEST CENTRE

The allotment of the test centre of candidate's choice is subject to the capacity and the number of candidates applying for that test centre. Once the required number of candidates have been accommodated in a given centre, the remaining candidates who had opted for that centre will be allotted to another centre. Also, if for any reason, including poor response of candidates for appearing at a particular centre, an examination centre has to be cancelled, the candidates who had opted for that centre will be allotted another centre. Requests for change of Test Centre once allotted will not be entertained under any circumstances.

REGULATIONS AT THE TEST CENTRE

The examination hall will be opened 30 minutes before the commencement of the test. Candidates are expected to take their seats 15 minutes before the commencement of the test.

If candidates do not report in time, they are likely to miss some of the general instructions to be announced in the test hall. Candidates coming after 30 minutes of the commencement of the examination are not permitted to sit for the test.

Each candidate is given a seat with a number. Candidates must find out and occupy their allotted seats at least five minutes before the commencement of the test.

Candidates will not be allowed to carry any textual material, printed or written, bits of papers or any other material except the Hall Ticket inside the test hall. Candidates are also not permitted to bring calculators, slide rules, clock tables, electronic watches with facilities of calculators, laptop computers, personal stereo systems, walkie-talkie sets, mobile phones, paging devices or any other object/device that is likely to be of unfair assistance.

No candidate will be allowed to go outside the examination hall till the completion of the entire duration of time. Once candidates leave the hall (even if only to answer a call of nature) they cannot return under any circumstances. Smoking in the test hall is strictly prohibited. Tea, coffee, cold drinks or snacks are also not allowed to be taken into the examination hall.

Candidates shall maintain perfect silence and attend to their papers only. Any conversation or gesticulation or disturbance in the test hall shall be deemed as misbehaviour and if a candidate is found using unfair means or impersonation, their candidature will be cancelled and they will be liable to be debarred from taking examination either permanently or for a specified period to be decided by the University. The university reserves the right to withhold the result of such candidates.

During the examination time, the invigilator will check the Hall Tickets of candidates to satisfy about the identity of each candidate.

Candidates must sign the attendance sheet and declaration on the answer sheet in the presence of the invigilator. The invigilator will also put his/her signature in the place provided in the Hall Ticket and Answer Sheet on front side. The candidate should also put his/her left thumb impression in the attendance sheet in the presence of the invigilator.

A signal will be given at the beginning of the examination and at the half time. A signal will also be given before the closing time when candidates must stop marking the answers. Candidates must hand over their answer sheets and test booklets to the invigilator before they go out of their examination hall.

The answer sheet of the candidate who do not submit the Test Booklet will not be evaluated. Such candidates will be barred from writing the entrance test in future.

ANSWER SHEET

15 minutes before the commencement of the test, an Answer Sheet will be given. Candidates must ensure that the Answer Sheet they have received is correct and properly printed on both the sides.

The Hall Ticket number and the Test Booklet number as filled by the candidate in the Answer Sheet will be accepted as final for the purpose of evaluation. When these numbers are not written or written wrongly, the answer sheet will not be evaluated.

The candidate will be solely responsible for any error, omission in filling up the Hall Ticket number and the Test Booklet number.

FRONT SIDE OF ANSWER SHEET

On the front side of the answer sheet the candidates must write the Name (in capital letters) and Hall Ticket number in the appropriate places.

BACK SIDE OF ANSWER SHEET

On the backside, candidates must write Hall Ticket number and Test Booklet number in Arabic Numerals in appropriate boxes using a Hi-Tec point type black pen or 2B pencil and also completely darken corresponding circles.

TEST BOOKLET

At scheduled time for the commencement of the test, the candidates will receive a Test Booklet. They must ensure that the test booklet received by them is correct and printed properly. Each Test Booklet has a specific five digit Test Booklet number on the front page. Candidates must write this number on the backside of their Answer Sheet and also blacken circles at the appropriate place.

The order of questions is not same in all Test Booklets and they are jumbled. Candidates should never change their Test Booklet during the test.

Each MCQ will consist of a stem which may be in the form of a

question or an incomplete statement and four responses labelled A, B, C and D. One of the four responses only is the correct or most appropriate answer. Candidates should indicate the correct or most appropriate answer by darkening the appropriate circle completely.

MARKING OF ANSWERS

Candidates should not indicate the answer in any other way like tick mark, cross, dot, line etc. The answer sheet will be evaluated by a Computer using Optical Mark Recognition (OMR). The following example illustrates the correct method of indicating the answer.

Question No. 131 in the Test booklet may be read as: The CASEIN contained in milk is a:

- A. Bacterium
- B. Carbohydrate
- C. Fat
- D. Protein

The correct response is (D). The candidate will locate question No. 131 in the answer sheet and darken the circle (D) as shown below:

If more than one circle is darkened or if the response is marked in any wrong manner as shown above, it shall be treated as wrong answer. Candidates who wish not to attempt a question should not touch the circle given against that question. Candidates must ensure that the Answer Sheet is not folded and make no stray marks on it.

The candidates must bring their own materials such as Hi-Tec point type black pens and 2B pencils. If pencils other than 2B are used, the Answer Sheet can be rejected by the Optical Scanner on which the Answer Sheets are scanned. They must also bring their own sharpener/erasers of good quality and have to ensure that no mark is visible after erasing any answer.

CHANGING ANSWERS

If a candidate wants to change any answer on his/her answer sheet, he/she must erase completely the existing pencil mark and then darken the appropriate circle with 2B pencil. Candidates must ensure that they will not leave any visible mark after erasing. Otherwise the answer will be treated as wrong and negatively marked.

Candidates are advised to decide about the answer before they mark it on answer sheet. This is especially important for candidates using Hi-Tec point type black pen, whose markings cannot or properly be erased.

They must ensure that the circle is completely darkened with Hi-Tec point type black pen or 2B pencil. A lightly or faintly darkened

circle will be treated as wrong and will be rejected by the Optical Scanner.

ROUGH WORK

Candidates should not do any rough work or writing work on the Answer Sheet.

All rough work should be done in the Test Booklet itself.

SCORING, NEGATIVE MARKING

Each question carries three marks. Each correct answer will be awarded three marks. One mark will be deducted from the score for each wrong answer. An unanswered question will receive no (positive/negative) mark.

More than one answer indicated against a question will be deemed as wrong and negatively marked.

ANSWER SCRIPTS

Requests for marksheets and / or re-checking, re-totalling or re-evaluation of entrance test answer scripts will not be entertained.

SOME USEFUL ADVICE:

- Ensure that you have collected your Hall Ticket, Hi -Tec point type black pen or 2B pencil, Eraser of good quality, Sharpener before leaving to the test centre
- If you live far from the City / Town which is your centre for the test, it is prudent to reach there on the previous day itself
- Get a good night's rest so that you arrive at the venue of the examination, well rested and alert
- Bring a watch that is accurate
- Start early from your home/hotel/accommodation
- Pace yourself properly without compromising speed and accuracy
- During the test, check frequently to make sure that you are answering questions in the right spots, this is especially important if you leave questions unanswered along the way

COMPUTER BASED ONLINE ENTRANCE TEST

The salient features of the computer based ONLINE entrance test are:

- The candidate sits in front of the computer and the questions are presented on the monitor and the candidate submits his answers through the use of key board or mouse. The computer is connected to the server, which delivers the test, in real time through a reliable connectivity.
- Online Entrance Test assumes that the candidate has basic familiarity with use of computers like use of keyboard and mouse operation. It is the responsibility of the candidate to acquire these skills before appearing in the test and the University cannot take responsibility for the same.
- The sample test is available on the website <http://online.manipal.edu> on which the candidate can practice as many times desired.

ALLOTMENT OF TEST CENTRE

The allotment of the test centre of candidate's choice is subject to the capacity and the number of candidates applying for that test centre. Once the required number of candidates have been accommodated in a given centre, the remaining candidates who had opted for that centre will be allotted to another centre. Also, if for any reason, including poor response of candidates for appearing at a particular centre, an examination centre has to be cancelled, the candidates who had opted for that centre will be allotted another centre. Requests for change of Test Centre once allotted will not be entertained under any circumstances.

No candidate will be allowed to appear for the ONLINE test twice for the same entrance test in a year. In the event of such attempt, their candidature will be cancelled and they will be liable to be debarred from taking examination either permanently or for a specified period to be decided by the University. The University reserves the right to withhold the result of such candidates.

ALLOTMENT OF TEST SCHEDULE

There will be 3 tests held in a given day. The exact time and date for a given candidate will be allotted randomly and informed through the hall ticket.

Candidates will not be allowed to carry any textual material, printed or written, bits of papers or any other material except the Hall Ticket inside the test hall. Candidates are also not permitted to bring calculators, slide rules, clark tables, electronic watches with facilities of calculators, laptop computers, personal stereo systems, walkie-talkie sets, mobile phones, paging devices or any other object/device that is likely to be of unfair assistance.

The physical presence of the candidate at the counselling is mandatory. If a candidate is prevented by unavoidable circumstances from being physically present for the counselling, he/she may authorise another individual to represent him/her at the counselling.

This representative must carry the authorisation in the format given in the page 64 and bring all the documents and the full fees. Absence of the candidate or his/her representative at the indicated reporting time and date will result in the instantaneous forfeiture of any claim for a seat.

The choice of course made by the candidate/representative is final

and binding and cannot be altered later under any circumstances.

Only the candidate/representative will be allowed into the counselling hall. They will be called in the order of their ranks and offered the seats available at that point of time. They are permitted to choose any of the seats available during their turn. Ties will be resolved in the manner described below:

- a) The Net Average Score (NAS) obtained during the qualifying examination will be calculated by taking the gross average marks of all the Board/University examinations and subtracting a factor determined on the basis of the number of failures. The tied candidates will be re-ranked on the basis of NAS.
- b) In the event of NAS of two (or more) tied candidates being identical, the candidate with fewer failures will be ranked higher.

For the purpose of this rule, each failure in a subject in a (semester/year) Board/University examination will be reckoned as one failure. Non-appearance in a particular subject in an examination for whatever reason will also be counted as failure.

WAIT LIST

When all the seats in a given course/s are filled, candidates may choose to be waitlisted.

- i) Candidates may opt for one course and simultaneously get waitlisted for other course/s. Such candidates are required to pay the fee for the course to which they are admitted. Failure to pay the fee will result in instantaneous forfeiture of the seat and also the position in wait list.

On subsequent selection to the course to which they are waitlisted, these candidates need to pay the difference of fees, if any.

- ii) Candidates withdrawing at a subsequent stage from the course to which they are admitted will also lose their position in the waiting list.

- iii) Candidates who opt only to be waitlisted, need not pay any fee until they receive the selection intimation from the university that they have been selected for admission from the waiting list as a consequence of withdrawal or cancellation of admission of any originally admitted candidate.

iv) The University officer in charge of counselling will declare the waiting list for each course as closed as soon as he/she is satisfied that an adequate number of candidates have been waitlisted for that course.

v) Candidates can waitlist only for the course and not for the campus.

DOCUMENTS

During counselling all candidates are required to produce the original and two sets of photocopies of following documents. In the event of admission, these documents will be retained by the University till the candidate completes the course.

Note: The first year tuition and other fees given in the table above is tentative. The final fee will be determined on the basis of the recommendations of a committee of experts.

NOTE (1): In addition to the above all the candidates are required to pay the following at the time of counselling/admission.

- Rs.3,500 towards the registration for General, MAHE and In-service category candidates.
- USD 300 towards the registration for Foreign/NRI category candidates.
- Rs. 7,500 towards refundable Caution Deposit only for General, MAHE and In-service category candidates.

NOTE (2): Fee remittance - NRI/Foreign category students: Candidates are required to remit the fee in US Dollars only by demand draft drawn in favour of MAHE payable at Manipal or Udupi or Bangalore. Demand drafts must be crossed and Payees A/C only.

NOTE (3): Fee remittance - General category students: Candidates are required to remit the fee only by demand draft drawn in favour of MAHE payable at Manipal or Udupi or Bangalore. Demand drafts must be crossed and Payees A/C only.

NOTE (4): The fees mentioned in page 66 & 67 are for the first year. For detailed fee structure of the remaining years, visit <http://admissions.manipal.edu>.

NOTE (5): All candidates must pay the fees at the time of counselling/admission. Failure to pay the fees on or before the date(s) specified will result in the instantaneous forfeiture of the seat as well as any fees already paid except caution deposit. Tuition & other fees for the subsequent years must be remitted before the commencement of the academic year on the dates to be notified irrespective of the academic progress of the student.

NOTE (6): Expenses for clinical training, fieldwork & thesis work - As part of curriculum, the MPT, MOT, MASLP and Nursing courses involve extensive community/field work outside Manipal. In addition, all MPT/MOT/MASLP candidates will be posted to MAHE's associated hospitals and other specialised hospitals outside Manipal for clinical training. All the expenses related to such training and work must be borne by the candidates.

NOTE (7): Candidates admitted to MD/MS courses in Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Community Medicine and Forensic Medicine under the General and MAHE category are

exempted from paying the tuition fee provided they execute a service agreement to serve for a period of 5 years or such extended period as may be stated in the agreement in any of the constituent colleges/associated hospitals of MAHE or any of the institution of the Manipal group after the completion of the course. However they have to pay the other fees.

NOTE (8): Candidates admitted under Foreign/NRI category to MD/MS in non clinical specialities like Anatomy, Biochemistry, Community Medicine, Forensic Medicine, Microbiology, Pathology, Pharmacology and Physiology, the first year fees is USD 10,000 (tuition fee USD 6,500, other fees USD 3,500).

NOTE (9): Admission to all the DM and MCh courses is only against the service agreement. Candidates are exempted from paying 100% tuition fee against a 5 year service agreement or 60% tuition fee against a 3 year service agreement to serve for a period of 5/3 years or such extended period as may be stated in the agreement in any of the constituent college/associated hospitals of MAHE or any of the institution of the Manipal group after the completion of the course. However, they have to pay the other fees.

NOTE (10): Admissions to 50% seats of MSc Nursing course is against service agreement. Candidates admitted under this category are exempted from paying the tuition fee provided they execute a service agreement to serve for a period of 2 years or such extended period as may be stated in the agreement in any of the constituent colleges/associated hospitals of MAHE or any of the institution of the Manipal group after the completion of the course. However, they have to pay the other fees.

NOTE (11): Candidates admitted under In-service category are required to execute a service agreement to serve for a period of 5 years or such extended period as may be stated in the agreement in any of the constituent colleges/associated hospitals of MAHE or any of the institution of the Manipal group after the completion of the course. However they have to pay the tuition & other fees in full.

NOTE (12): Candidates admitted under MAHE category are required to execute a service agreement to serve for a period of 3 years or such extended period as may be stated in the agreement in

any of the constituent colleges/associated hospitals of MAHE or any of the institution of the Manipal group after the completion of the course. However they have to pay the tuition & other fees in full.

NOTE (13): The fee mentioned for the MPhil Nursing course is for the entire duration of the course.

NOTE (14): The registration and caution deposit of Rs.11,000 need not be remitted by applicants pursuing MSc Biotechnology immediately after BSc Biotechnology (Integrated) course.

NOTE (15): For Panchakarma course the fees mentioned above is for the entire duration of the course. Candidates need to pay caution deposit of Rs. 1,000 and need not pay the registration fees of Rs. 3,500.

REFUND RULES

Generally no refund of fee is permitted on account of withdrawal/absence from college or other reasons once a student is admitted to any course of study.

1. A refund claim may, however, be admitted on merits after due consideration of the request by the University. If approved, the amount to be refunded shall be within the limits stated below:

(i) Anytime after admission, but before the date of commencement of classes

General/MAHE/In-service category - Total fees after deducting Rs. 10,000.

Foreign/NRI category - Total fees after deducting USD 500

(ii) After the date of commencement of classes - No refund, required to pay the remaining years tuition fees

(iii) 'CAUTION DEPOSIT' is refundable after the completion of the course or candidate leaving the course for any other reason.

2. In all cases where the student has been admitted to the course after the commencement of classes through the waiting list or otherwise, the number of days specified above will be reckoned from the date of "commencement of classes" and not from the date of their actual admission.

3. Any student who withdraws from the course after the date of commencement of classes as mentioned in para 2 above will be required to remit to the University, in addition to the amount already forfeited, the tuition fee payable for the remaining period of the course.

4. In case of Foreign/NRI candidates, the refunds will be made in accordance with Foreign Exchange Regulations. The Reserve Bank of India has been permitting refund only to the extent of Indian Rupees originally realised by the authorised dealer/bank. In such cases there is likely to be variation in the US dollar refund and may not be equal to the amount remitted by the student.

5. All refunds will be processed by the Student Finance Office of the University upon receiving the approval from the Registrar based on the recommendation from the Deputy Registrar, Admissions. Requests for withdrawals should be made in the prescribed application available at the Admissions Office. Refund will be made only after the candidate has surrendered the ID card, original fee receipt and the dues clearance certificate.

IDENTITY CARD

Each student is issued an ID card (Combo card). The ID card is valid for the regular duration of the course. ID card is also valid for Medicare facilities for the regular duration of the course.

If a student fails in the final examination and continue his/her studies beyond the period specified for the course, the student must renew the ID card by paying the required ID/Medicare fee.

LOSS OF ID CARD: If a student for any reason loses the ID card, the loss of ID card must be brought to the notice of the Admissions Office in writing along with the copy of police complaint. The duplicate/replacement ID card will be issued on payment of Rs.500.

MEDICAL FACILITIES FOR STUDENTS

Medicare scheme applies to all bonafide students of the University for the entire duration of the course.

Student ID is valid for availing Medicare facilities in the associated hospitals of the University for the entire duration of the course.

If the student does not renew the ID card on expiry, the ID card cannot be used for Medicare facilities and renewal may be approved after collecting the renewal fee for the default period. But coverage for Medicare will begin only after one month from the date of payment of renewal fee.

FAMILY COVER

Specific provision is available to give Medicare cover to the spouse and unmarried dependent children of a postgraduate student.

- i. The premium for the entire period is payable in advance at the time of admission itself. If students get married/beget children subsequently, the premium is to be paid within one month from the date of marriage/child birth.
- ii. Applications for granting family cover will not be entertained any time after admission or after the expiry of one month from the date of marriage or child birth, whichever is later. Subsequent enrolment may be approved at the sole discretion of the University. In such cases, coverage will begin after three months from the date of payment.

BENEFITS

NRI/FOREIGN CATEGORY STUDENTS:

- i. General hospitalisation (including drugs, blood excluding diet) in special ward (Plan A).
- ii. Outpatient benefits (excluding drugs, materials etc.)

GENERAL/OTHER CATEGORY STUDENTS:

- i. General hospitalisation (including drugs, blood excluding diet) in semi-special ward (Plan B).
- ii. Outpatient benefits (excluding drugs, materials etc.)

NOTE: If a student is admitted to higher type of ward than eligible as per Medicare they have to pay the difference in the bill of the ward occupied and eligible.

STIPEND

All the DM and MCh students will be paid a monthly stipend of Rs.7,000 in first year, Rs.7,500 in second year and Rs.8,000 in third year.

All MD, MS, PG Diploma, MDS students (including those joining under the service agreement scheme) will be paid a monthly stipend of Rs.2,000 in first year, Rs.2,500 in second year and Rs.3,000 in third year.

BPT, BOT, BSc MLT, BSc RT, BASLP, BSc OPT, BSc MIT, BSc Nursing students doing internship in any of the hospitals of MAHE will be paid a monthly stipend of Rs.1,000 and MBBS, BDS candidates will be paid a monthly stipend of Rs.1,500 during the period of internship.

The fees and refund information given above is indicative and MAHE reserves the right to make changes. Any changes in the above will be informed separately.

SCHOLARSHIPS

With the objective of encouraging meritorious students and academic excellence, many scholarships are offered for deserving candidates. The quantum of scholarship and the number of scholarships are subject to change from time to time. Details will be published in our website in due course of time.

PHILIPS SCHOLARSHIP - Philips has instituted 10 scholarships, each upto Rs. 4 lakhs, for those admitted to MS Embedded Systems and MTech Computer Science & Engineering courses.

GE SCHOLARSHIP - MIT and MCIS are listed under the GE scholarship programme. Every year, 2 students each of MTech - Illumination Technology and MS - Medical Software get this scholarship. The scholarship covers the complete expenses including fees, accommodation and other expenses. The selection of students for these scholarships is based on GE guidelines.

HARISH B FUND SCHOLARSHIP - MAHE has also instituted 3 scholarships for MCIS students in the name of late director Prof. Harish B, for the students of MS - VLSI CAD, MS - Medical Software and MS - Embedded Systems.

AICTE SCHOLARSHIP - In pursuance of the policy framework for promotion of post graduate education and research in Engineering & Technology of MHRD, AICTE provides financial assistance to the GATE qualified students enrolled for MTech/MPharm courses.

ISLE SCHOLARSHIP - The Indian Society of Lighting Engineers offer TWO scholarships to the students admitted to MTech Illumination Technology and TWO more, to the students of final year B E (E & E) branch, every year. These scholarships are sponsored by Philips India Ltd. (Two), Bajaj Electricals Ltd. (One) and Thorn Lighting India (One).

ITC SCHOLARSHIP - ITC Hotel Limited has also instituted scholarship worth Rs. 3.5 lakhs to the BHM students excelling in operational subjects and for the best all round graduating student.

TEACHING ASSISTANTSHIPS - 3 to 5 teaching assistantship are available to students joining MTech & MS Courses with a monthly remuneration of upto Rs. 5000.

FEE WAIVER - Candidates within the first 100 ranks of UGET and admitted to MBBS, BDS, BE & BPharm courses are offered 100% freeship. Such freeships are limited and could be upto 5% of the total seats under that category.

SBI SCHOLAR LOAN - MAHE has tied up with State Bank of India to provide student loans at concessional rates (8.75% upto 4 lakh and 9% for above 4 lakh). Loans upto 7.5 lakh is offered without any collateral. For the present, this facility is available only to those admitted to Kasturba Medical College (KMC), Manipal and Mangalore. Plans are on the unveil to extend the facility to the students of other institutions also.

HOSTEL INFORMATION

The hostel provides a cot, a mattress, a study table, a chair and a cupboard for each student. Every hostel has solar heated water facility, water cooler, common telephone, common TV room, common reading room etc. Students can take an independent telephone connection on additional payment. Adequate dining facilities are available for all students. Membership to any of the mess run in the campus is compulsory. Some hostels have

gymnasium and indoor games facilities. Food court caters variety of food to suit all tastes..

First year students will be provided double/triple rooms only. First year students who desire to have AC rooms may reserve their names with Chief Warden at the time of counselling. NRI/Foreign student may reserve their rooms in advance while submitting their application forms. Reservation will be based on their registration for the course with the Admissions Office. Single rooms will be made available to students on waiting list seniority.

At Manipal campus first year students are generally allotted hostel as follows:-

NOTE: The above is a general guideline. Depending on availability, students may be allotted any hostel. All the candidates admitted to BHM and PG Diploma in Dietetics will stay in WGSMA hostels only.

ALLOTMENT OF ROOMS

1. All students are required to bring 3 passport size photographs for hostel admission at the time of counselling.
2. Every attempt will be made to provide hostel accommodation to all students. Students of the senior classes may be permitted to stay in private houses of relatives or friends with the prior permission of the Dean/Director and written consent of parent/guardian. The application must be submitted in the prescribed form and approval must be obtained before taking up residence outside the campus.
3. It is mandatory for all first year students to stay in the hostels and be a member of the mess in the hostel. In exceptional cases permission may be granted by the Dean/Director to stay out before joining the hostel.
4. Students must occupy rooms specifically allotted to them. They are not allowed to change rooms except with the written permission of the Warden/Chief Warden. However, students can pair up as per their choice within first few days.
5. Change of accommodation from one hostel to another during a term is generally not permitted.
6. Allotment made to a student is subject to cancellation if he/she fails to occupy the room in the prescribed time. Students will also forfeit their rooms if they fail to clear all their dues to the hostel by the appointed day. In such cases they will be asked to vacate the hostel.
7. Hostel accommodation is allotted purely at the discretion of the Chief Warden and on condition that the student agrees to abide by all the rules and regulations of the hostel. The Chief Warden

may refuse hostel facilities without assigning any reason or remove a student from the hostel at any time on disciplinary grounds.

8. The Chief Warden reserves the right to break open rooms in case of any violation of hostel rules, suspected unlawful activities or on the basis of security risk perceived.

HOSTEL FACILITIES FEE AND DEPOSIT

1. The hostel facilities fee is collected on an annual basis. It is compulsory for all the students (except local residents and post graduate students) to reside in the hostel for the first year. The fee varies with each category of accommodation and is given at page 72. The hostel facilities fee will be collected at the commencement of each academic year as per the schedule notified by the University or by the hostel accounting office.

Delayed payments will attract a fine of 12% per annum computed for each default day. Hostel facilities fee for each academic year will be published on the hostel notice board. No individual intimation will be given to the students/parents/guardian. Every student is expected to ascertain this from the notice board.

2. Every student admitted to the hostel is required to make a Hostel Deposit. The deposit will be refunded when the student vacates the hostel on production of a 'Dues Clearance Certificate'. The amount of hostel deposit is published along with the schedule of hostel facilities fee.

3. Hostel Facilities Fee for Casual Students: Students who do not complete their studies within the regular period stipulated for the course may be allotted accommodation for a further term(s) on non-priority basis subject to the following:

50% of the annual hostel facilities fee will be charged to such students for a term not exceeding six months. The student will have to pay the hostel fee for the entire year for retaining accommodation beyond a period of six months.

4. Payment of Hostel Facilities Fee/Deposit: The hostel facilities fee/deposit may be remitted by a demand draft drawn in favour of the following:

- MAHE HOSTELS made payable at Manipal/Udupi/Mangalore for MAHE hostels

- MIT HOSTELS made payable at Manipal/Udupi for MIT hostels
- WGSMA HOSTELS made payable at Manipal/Udupi for WGSMA hostels

HOSTEL FACILITIES FEE REFUND APPLICABLE TO STUDENTS OF 2nd YEAR AND ONWARDS

- a. Hostel facilities fee refund is considered on monthly basis. Charging on daily basis for overstay beyond one month is not permitted and such overstay will be considered as full month stay.
- b. This rule is applicable to all the hostels-AC/Non AC hostels and all Students/Interns/Tutors/PG Cum tutors/Research fellows.
- c. This rule will be strictly complied with and no representations from students will be entertained.
- d. Students vacating the hostel must submit to the Hostel Accounting Office a hostel vacating form duly approved by the Chief Warden along with no dues certificate from the mess.

In the case where the student is shifting from one hostel to another hostel, the date of allotment of room in all the above cases will be the date of initial hostel allotment and not the shifting date.

UTILITY CHARGES

1. Utility charges comprising of electricity, water and other utilities will be collected annually along with hostel facilities fee. The actual bill towards these utilities will be announced monthly. The student will be required to pay any increase in the actual charges as compared to the amount collected in advance. Any amount collected in excess after ascertaining the actual charges will be adjusted against the charges for the subsequent period.

2. In case of short duration of stay not exceeding one month, the utility charges will be charged on the following basis:

- Charges will be for 1 week for stay upto 1 week or less
- Charges will be for 2 weeks for stay from 1 week to 2 weeks
- Charges will be for one month for stay from 2 weeks to 1 month

3. Electricity charge for specified equipment/gadgets will be collected monthly in addition to the regular utility charges. The schedule of such charges is published at the commencement of each academic year. Students will take written permission from the Chief Warden for using any specified equipment/gadget in their rooms. No such equipment/gadget will be used without the written permission.

HOSTEL MESS AND CAFETERIA

All members of the hostel will automatically be the members of the mess. The mess/cafeteria charges will be collected at the end of each month.

PAYMENT OF MONTHLY DUES

1. Mess charges will be published on the hostel notice boards by the first week of the following month. All mess charges for each month must be paid within 7 days of such publication. No individual intimation will be given to the students/parents/guardian.
2. Any damage/breakage to hostel property will be charged to the occupants of the room/block with fine.
3. Payment towards mess charges may be made in cash or by local cheque. A fine of Rs. 500/- will be levied in case the bank dishonours a cheque besides taking any legal action as may be considered in specific cases.
4. Delayed payments will attract a fine @12% per annum computed for each default day. The fine will be calculated from the day following the last date for payment of the bills.
5. In case of non-payment of mess charges for two months or more, the names of such students will be removed from the mess/cafeteria rolls and such defaulters will cease to dine in any

of the messes/cafeteria. They may also be disallowed from residing in the hostels beyond the period for which hostel fee has already been paid. The names of the defaulters will be communicated to the respective Dean/Director of the colleges for further action. The Dean/Director reserves the option to suspend any student from attending classes, labs, clinics whose bills are not paid for more than two months.

6. Students who have been discontinued/disallowed from dining in the mess/cafeteria and/or from residing in the hostels will not be permitted to rejoin mess/cafeteria or hostel unless they have cleared the dues and have paid.

CHANGE OF ROOM

1. A change of accommodation from one category to another will be allowed only at the beginning of each quarter in a calendar year.
2. A remission in the hostel facilities fee will be given when the student is allowed to move into a lower category of accommodation. Similarly, the difference in hostel facilities fee will be collected when a student is allowed to move into a higher category of accommodation.
3. The student must submit to the hostel accounting office the prescribed form for shifting into a different category of hostel accommodation duly signed by the Chief Warden.

HOSTEL DISCIPLINE

NO STUDENT SHOULD STAY AWAY FROM HIS/HER ROOM DURING THE NIGHT EXCEPT WITH PRIOR WRITTEN PERMISSION OF THE WARDEN. ANY STUDENT, WHO WISHES TO LEAVE THE CAMPUS TEMPORARILY OR OTHERWISE, SHOULD OBTAIN THE PERMISSION OF WARDEN IN WRITING. THOSE APPLYING FOR PERMISSION MUST STATE THE DATE AND TIME OF HIS/HER INTENDED DEPARTURE AND RETURN AS WELL AS THE DESTINATION.

STUDENTS ARE REQUESTED TO AVOID SINGING ALOUD, SHOUTING OR MAKING ALL TYPES OF NOISES WHICH ARE LIKELY TO DISTRACT THE ATTENTION OF THOSE WHO MAY BE STUDYING IN THEIR ROOMS OR HOSTEL LIBRARIES.

PETS OF ALL KINDS ARE PROHIBITED INSIDE THE HOSTEL. FEEDING STRAY DOGS OR CATS IN THE HOSTEL PREMISES IS NOT PERMITTED.

RAGGING IN ANY FORM IS BANNED INSIDE AND OUTSIDE THE CAMPUS.

THE STUDENTS ARE ADVISED NOT TO KEEP LARGE AMOUNT OF CASH OR VALUABLES IN THE ROOM. THE STUDENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SAFETY OF HIS/HER BELONGINGS INSIDE THE ROOM.

ALL VISITORS INCLUDING PARENTS/GUARDIANS MUST BE ENTERTAINED ONLY IN THE VISITORS LOUNGE AND DURING VISITING HOURS ONLY.

ANY DESTRUCTION CAUSED TO HOSTEL PROPERTY WILL ATTRACT FINE.
